

BOSSNET TO COME
HERE AND TAKE ON
CARGO OF WHEAT

French Bark Fixed by North-western Warehouse Co.—Solveig May Also Load at This Port.

The French bark Bossnet, now on her way from Newcastle, N. S. W., with a cargo of coal, has been chartered by Balfour Guthrie & Company for a cargo of wheat from this port or Puget sound.

The Bossnet, 1964 tons net register, Captain Letrouquer, is out 60 days today from Newcastle with a cargo of coal for J. & A. Brown, and should be due to arrive in the Bay city almost any day.

The German bark Solveig, 2323 tons net, Captain Bogh, is now in port at San Francisco, having arrived there November 17 from Batavia with over 5000 tons of sugar. She was taken to load at Portland or Puget sound for St. Vincent for orders, with the option of loading barley at San Francisco.

Although several cargoes of barley left this port last year, there has been none shipped so far this season and shippers say that there is not much prospect of any being sent out this year from this port, as it is all needed for home consumption.

It is expected that the German bark Solveig will finish loading at noon today with about 80,000 bushels of wheat for the United Kingdom and she will probably leave down tomorrow or Wednesday. She is under charter to A. Berg.

USE LEAD CONSTANTLY

Breakwater Has to Feel Way Up Coast From Yaquina.

Thick weather and a strong southeast gale made it necessary for the steamer Breakwater, which arrived from Coos Bay at 8:30 this morning, to come up the coast from Yaquina to the Columbia river lightship by means of the lead, which was used constantly.

There is no question in my mind, said Captain Macginn, "but that when the jetty has been extended out as far as No. 2 buoy, there will be 30 feet of water on the jetty."

He said that the appearance of the bar when the Breakwater passed in at about 9 o'clock yesterday morning showed that the jetty was causing the channel to deepen all the time. He said that between the lightship and the bar it was breaking heavily, and one sea went aboard the steamer, the water running into his cabin, but as soon as the bar was reached a great change was noted in the force of the breakers, which were not as heavy as out near the lightship.

When the Breakwater came in yesterday morning the steamers Rosecrans and Geo. W. Elder were lying outside. The latter came in this morning. The Breakwater discharged 300 tons of salmon at Astoria, and brought 150 tons of coal and 50 tons of general freight here. She also had 80 passengers.

LOGS BREAK LOOSE.

Four Rafts in Cowlitz Set Adrift by Gale Yesterday.

Because of the gale blowing down the river yesterday, the steamers Sarah Dixon and M. E. Henderson were unable to tow some rafts which were to be brought up from the Cowlitz river. The high winds made it impossible for the steamers to move the rafts and they were compelled to give up the job for the day. Four of six rafts in the Cowlitz, which were to be towed out by the boats of the Willamette and Columbia River Towing company, broke loose during the gale yesterday, but were caught by the boom farther down the river and did not get into the Columbia.

Oil Barge Launched.

At the Willamette Iron & Steel Works a new steel barge, built for the Western Transportation & Towing company, was launched yesterday.

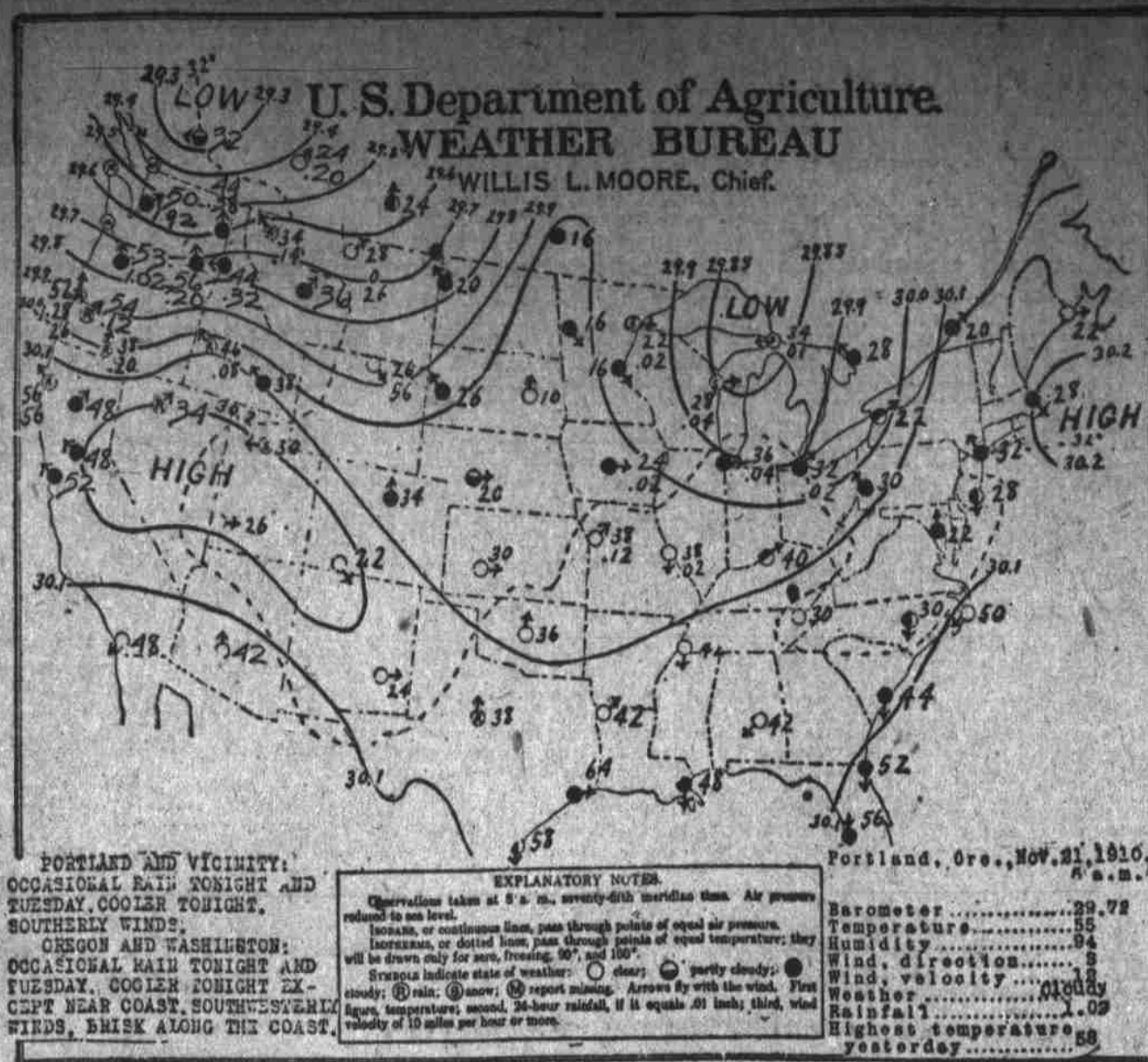

It is expected that the steamer Shoshone, now on the Oregon drydock, will be floated from that structure Saturday.

With the rise in the river caused by the rains of the last few days, the Oregon City Transportation company have resumed their steamer service to Corvallis and are now covering all points on the upper Willamette this side of that place.

To discharge 1,200,000 feet of Japanese oak logs, the Oriental liner Rykja shifted from Albers dock to the Bandfield dock at 9 o'clock this morning. She will return later to Albers to discharge sulphur.

Laden with 300 tons of general freight and 300 tons of cement, the steamer Carco, Captain Ahlin, arrived Saturday afternoon from San Francisco. She is reported as having had a rough trip.

In such way as they could Richardson's sanity. He also admitted going to the county jail yesterday afternoon and talking with them after they had examined Richardson. Responding to question by the court, Page said he did not notify the attorneys for the defense.

He maintained he had a perfect right to have this examination made. Logan replied that the defense had no objection to an examination and would have consented if notified as one of the defendant's attorneys could be present. But he said these experts had no right to go there, leading Richardson to believe he was talking with his own physician. He denounced this as a high-handed proceeding by the district attorney and desired to register a protest.

Misconduct Says Gatens. "I think this is misconduct and should be censured," said Judge Gatens. "It was certainly unethical. To send objection to examine a man on trial for his life without notice to the court or the attorneys on the other side is unprofessional and highly improper."
