

OFFICIAL FIGURES SHOW HOME RULE CARRIES BY 2542

Heaviest Adverse Majority Is 58,342, Denying \$1000 Increase of Salary to Baker County Judge.

Official figures on the vote for and against the various initiative and referendum measures submitted to the people in the recent election appear in tabulated form on this page. These figures were compiled by the secretary of state.

Many interesting facts are disclosed. While the prohibition amendment was defeated by a majority of 17,681, and the majority against the prohibition bill was 36,512, the home rule amendment, giving to cities and towns the exclusive power to license the sale of liquor, was passed by the narrow margin of 2542, or little more than half the majority indicated by unofficial reports immediately after the election.

Bourne's amendment extending the provisions of the direct primary law to presidential nominations scratched through by a still smaller margin, the majority being only 1728.

The heaviest adverse majority cast against any measure was that by which the bill proposing to add \$1000 to the salary of the county judge of Baker county was defeated. The bill was snowed under by a majority of 58,342.

Nine of the 22 measures on the ballot were adopted. The vote for and against each of these was as follows:

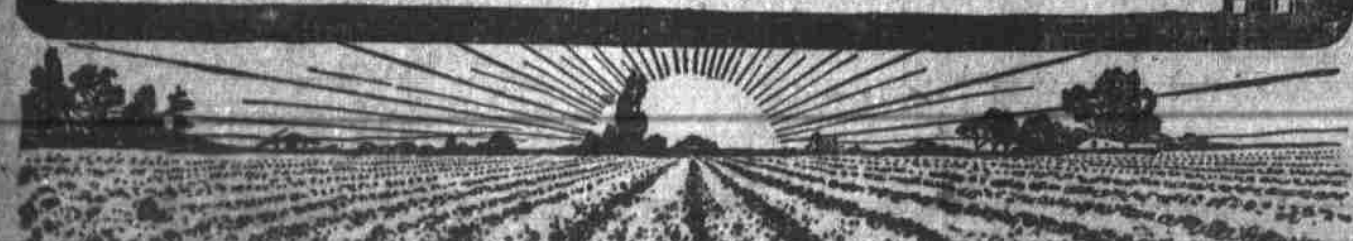
