Prior to the record made by the Bjorn sen, the largest wheat cargo ever set affoat from this port was that of the British steamer Franklyn, which sailed from here in December, 1896, with a cargo of 263,579 bushels. Since that time several tramps have taken out large cargoes of wheat, but none of them had reached that point even. The Bjørnsen is expected to get away for the sea this afternoon.
