The Charges in a Nutshell. By Eaton—That Senator Bourne, C. W. Fulton and W. S. U'Ren organized the house; that Seneca Fouts, as representative for Rusk, went beyond instructions and made a deal with Thompson for votes; that negotiations involving "dirty deals" were made to him (Eaton) which would give him the speakership, and that various threats were made of what would happen unless he desisted in his fight upon the speakership issue.
