

CHILDREN SUBMITS NEW MILITIA BILL

Naval Measure Provides for Longer Term of Enlistment Than Abrams Bill.

SHIRKS FIND EASY COIN HARD TO GET

Real Hours, No Work No Pay, Are Novel Rules for Clerks and Stenos.

Salem, Or., Jan. 19.—For the first time in the Oregon legislature definite rules have been adopted governing clerks and stenographers employ in the house. The rules committee reported yesterday recommending that each group of three representatives shall have one stenographer and one clerk.

Clerks are required to report daily at 8 o'clock, remain on duty until 10:30, report again at 12:30 and to work until 2. They will finish their work between 4 and 6 p. m. Stenographers will work from 9 to 11, from 1 to 4 and from 7 to 9. Emerys absent during these hours are not to receive pay and they cannot remain away without permission of the chief clerk, and then only on furnishing a reasonable excuse.

NEW OREGON HOLIDAY FAILS TO PASS BY 3

Salem, Or., Jan. 19.—The bill to make October 12 of each year a legal holiday, to be called Columbus day, failed to pass in the house yesterday afternoon lacking three of a majority. The Multnomah delegation, particularly Seneca Fouts, W. J. Clemens and Ralph Clyde, worked hard to win success for it.

STATE GRANGE TO FIGHT ROAD BILLS
