AND FLAGG BLAMES SPECIAL COMMITTEE FOR MISSING PAGES

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) St. Helens, Or., March 13.—E. H. Flagg, late chief clerk of the state senate, "passes the buck" for the unsatisfactory condition of the senate journal to the special senate committee on revision of the journal, of which Senator Bean of Eugene was chairman.

He declares that throughout the session the records were in possession of this committee and its clerk, Colonel Mercer. When the session closed and he undertook the work of revision after the courts had sustained his right to do this work, he says he found numerous pages were missing.

Flagg further says it is impossible to make the senate journal a reliable record by which to prove the succeeding steps essential to making a law. He refused to make the usual certification of the record, merely filing a certificate that the record was the best he could make under the circumstances.
