"Quincy Adams Sawyer" Has Realistic Staging and Is Funny.

"Quincy Adams Sawyer" again appears to delight Portland audiences, and the ever-welcome rural comedy with the down east setting, as presented by the Baker stock company, has lost nothing of its original freshness in their handling of it.

From the moment that the piece opens in the first act in the country grocery store of "Bonnet Hill," where Quincy Adams Sawyer, the city chap, beats Bob Wood, the village bully, and thereby establishes his right to remain, the play is full of love and wholesome comedy that goes to the heart of the average person.

As Mrs. Hepsibah Putnam, the foster mother of Lindy, Lillian Andrews showed to particularly good advantage, and her characterization of that jealous and vindictive old lady was extremely realistic.

Thurston Hall, in the part of Sawyer, looked the part of the athletic Harvard graduate who stirred things up at Mason's Corners, and as usual he got out all there was of the part.

Other characters were well taken by the remaining members of the company.

Salem Council to Consider Franchise Tonight; Will Spend Half Million.

JONES WILL COME PROBABLY TUESDAY

United States District Attorney McCourt received word yesterday that Willard N. Jones, who is on his way to Portland from Washington to begin serving his jail sentence for land fraud conspiracy, will not arrive until Tuesday night and it is unlikely that Jones will begin serving his sentence until the following week.

He has asked permission for a few days' stay of judgment in which to secure the money with which to pay the \$12,000 fine that is a part of his punishment.

No word has been received yet about the standing of Franklin Pierce Mays' application for a pardon.

MME. PAVLOVA IS CALLED IN SCANDAL

Russian Dancer Who Appeared Here Is Summoned to St. Petersburg.

St. Petersburg, March 13.—An order of the Russian government that Mme. Anna Pavlova, the celebrated danseuse, now in America, shall return immediately to St. Petersburg to testify in the investigation of official frauds, is reported to be based on the friendship between her and M. Dandre, one of the officials under fire.

Dandre was a great admirer of Mme. Pavlova when she was winning her earlier triumphs in the Russian metropolis and it had been alleged by those opposed to him that a considerable portion of the money supposed to have been devoted to the construction of bridges on the Trans-Siberian railroad, was spent with intent to gratify the whims of the danseuse.
