Gleason who caught such a splendid game last Saturday will again be on the receiving end.

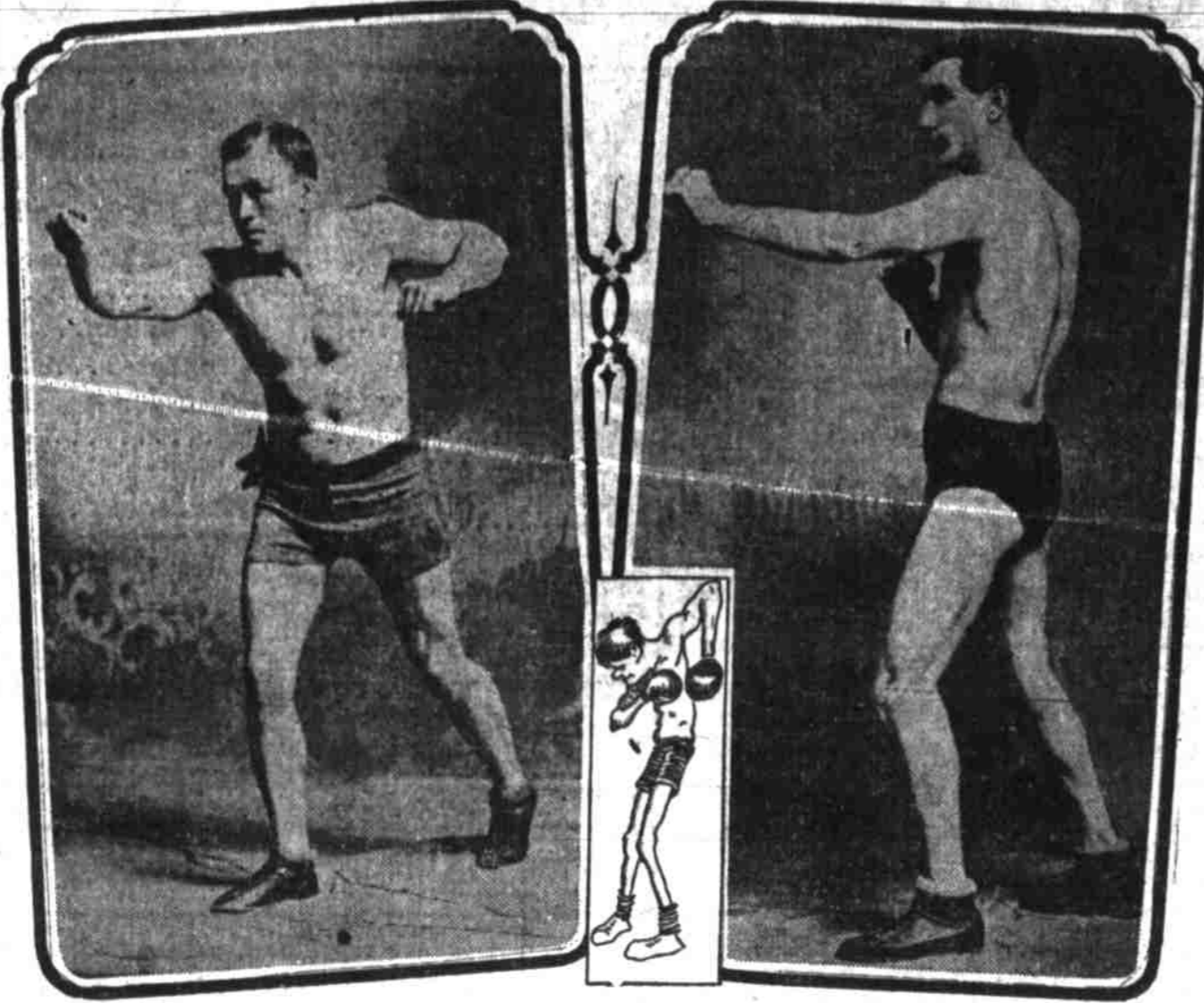
Another player on the club team who has been making good with a vengeance is Clark Hedrick.
