

LAKE WILL CLAIM 14,000 TAXPAYERS

Second Largest List in State
Possible Result of Big
Land Lottery.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)
Lakeview, Or., May 1.—Lake county will soon claim the second largest number of individual taxpayers in the state, despite the fact that there are only about 6000 residents in the county. This number, which will approximate 14,000, is due to the subdividing of the large holdings of the Oregon Valley Land company, which sold the California-Oregon Military road grant in tracts that went from ten to 1000 acres in area and which crosses the county. The same company also sold many sections of land in Goose Lake, Chewaucan and Warner valleys that were secured from the original owners. In addition to the taxpayers of these tracts are a bunch of 14,000 lots in addition to Lakeview platted by this company, which pay state and county taxes.
Sheriff Warner B. Snyder and Deputy Eph Miller have been working on the list of taxpayers since the first of this year and so far have been able to place about one-fourth of them on their roll

with a year's work ahead to get the balance recorded.
"Z. X." Cattle Company Accused.

Lakeview, Or., May 1.—Deputy United States Marshal Tom Hammersley of Portland is here serving papers on Francis A. Fitzpatrick of the "Z. X." Cattle company in the Chewaucan valley for "trespass on the Fremont forest reserve." It seems that many of the cattle of the company had been afflicted with scab and at the same time the supply of hay for feed had run so low that it was necessary to turn the stock on the range or see the animals starve in the pasture. Fitzpatrick took the chance of turning them loose after telling the people that he would pay for the dipping of every head of stock on the range at the "dipping pens" of the company. Some of the stock wandered onto the reserve, hence the action of the government. "Scab" has caused considerable trouble and loss during the past winter and it is believed that a large proportion of the cattle will be dipped within the next few months.

Paisley Gets New Hotel.

Lakeview, Or., May 1.—The new hotel at Paisley will be ready for occupancy about May 15. This building is the result of the efforts of some of the business men to handle the many home-seekers coming into the county and fill a long felt want among travelers. Paisley is also to have electric light and power generated from a plant in the Summer Lake valley.

CHAMPOEG MECCA FOR PIONEERS TOMORROW

Champoeg will be the mecca tomorrow for hundreds of pioneers on the occasion of the sixty-eighth anniversary celebration of the founding of American civilization on the Pacific slope. The principal speaker will be C. E. Moore of Portland. A few five-minute talks will follow along the line of emphasis upon the importance of giving more attention in this state to the greater recognition of our significant historical anniversaries.

The public generally, as well as pioneers, are urged to take part in this celebration which for 10 years has been held under the auspices of F. X. Matthieu, Cabin No. 12, Native Sons of Oregon.
Champoeg may be reached by taking the O. C. T. Co.'s boat at the foot of Taylor street at 6:45 a. m. sharp, or the Oregon Electric at the corner of Front and Jefferson streets at 9:30 a. m., and get off at Wilsonville and take the boat the remainder of the way to Champoeg, a distance of about seven miles. Returning, the boat will leave Champoeg at 4 p. m. and connect with cars at Wilsonville for Portland and Salem.
It is expected that Honorable F. X. Matthieu, the only survivor of the 102 persons who took part in the original meeting almost three score and ten years ago, will be present, notwithstanding he is past 95 years of age.

Socialist Mayor Promises.

St. Louis, May 1.—A two years' ride

on the "water wagon" and war to the death against the present police force are the two pledges which Marshall E. Kirkpatrick, socialist, assumed today with the office of mayor of Granite City, Ill. The population of the city is 15,000 and Kirkpatrick therefore is head of the second largest city under socialist government in the United States. Kirkpatrick advocates a municipal coal and ice plant, run without profit, and public ownership of the gas and electric lighting systems.

EDUCATED INDIAN IS COUNTERFEITER SUSPECT

Charles E. Brown, an Indian and a graduate of Carlisle, is under arrest at Klamath Falls charged with counterfeiting and is being held for the federal authorities here. He will probably be brought to Portland at once to await an investigation by the United States grand jury.

Brown, it is said, had in his rooms a counterfeiting plant for the manufacture of silver dollars and had one of his imitation coins partly made when surprised by the police of Klamath Falls.

A telegram received by United States authorities here says that Brown had been working in the Southern Pacific shops at Sacramento and has been in Klamath Falls a short time only.
It is the first time to the knowledge of federal officers here that an Indian has been accused of counterfeiting.

\$750,000 STATION DEDICATED TODAY

N. P., Great Northern and Harriman Lines Will Use Fine Tacoma Structure.

Tacoma, Wash., May 1.—Formal dedication will take place this evening of the magnificent \$750,000 union passenger station, which has just been completed by the Hill railroad system on the identical site of the dingy one story wooden building that served for many years as a depot. The new structure is pronounced the largest, most modern and most beautiful passenger station in the northwest. It will be used jointly by the Northern Pacific, Great Northern and Harriman lines.

Speakers at the exercises in the new station will include Governor Hay, Mayor Seymour, Howard Elliott, president of the Northern Pacific railroad; Judge Fred V. Brown, general western counsel of the Great Northern; Julius Kruttschnitt, vice president of the Harriman lines, and lesser officials of the three roads. Preceding the house warming speeches, orchestral concerts will be rendered and the public will be given

an opportunity to inspect the marble structure. A grand ball will commence in the concourse upon the conclusion of the dedication exercises, and will continue until midnight.
The station will be open for inspection all day tomorrow, and the first train will draw up under the shade of the new structure next Saturday.

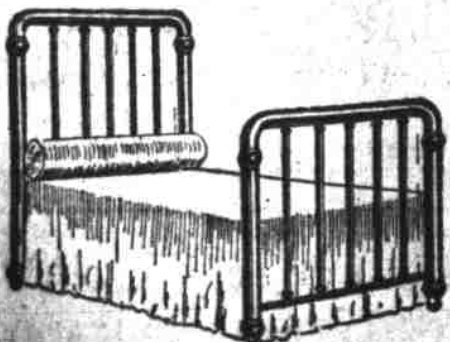

What Is the Great Improvement?
