

GRAND RONDE LAND TO BE RECLAIMED

Company Proposes Pumping Catherine Creek Water Near Union.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)
Union, Or., May 18.—A new corporation has entered the field of eastern Oregon and Union county for development and reclamation of land between Union and La Grande. It is the Eastern Oregon Realty company and the principal promoters are F. W. Harmon, manager of the Eastern Oregon Light & Power company, Ray Nye, president of the same company, and several eastern business men.
The company has become owner of 1600 acres of semi-arid land in Union county. Up to the present this land has produced practically nothing. Some water has been brought to a portion of it from a slough, which has been dammed and conserves a small portion of this water from the snow and spring rainfall. The portion securing water in this manner, however, is very small and uncertain. The plan of the company is to use the water of Catherine creek, which flows through the town of Union and from which the town gets its water supply, and improve the present site so there will be an abundance of water for the entire tract the year around. Catherine creek is a beautiful stream carrying enough water the year round to irrigate much of the Grand Ronde valley if necessary. A pumping plant will be installed.
Mr. Harmon says this is only the first of a number of similar projects under consideration by this company.

Mexican consul and others here today. Fryce was arrested several miles from the border line by American soldiers after he had spent a night and part of yesterday in this city. Kirk representing the league, announced they would take two courses—first, to institute habeas corpus proceedings for the release of Fryce, and second, to try to have General Diaz, commander of the United States troops here, arrested on a charge of having ordered an illegal arrest.

CORRAL, SAFE IN PARIS, SCOFFS AT PEACE PLANS; SEES NO END OF REVOLT

Paris, May 18.—Scoffing at plans by which it is expected to end the rebellion in Mexico, Vice President Ramon Corral, whose resignation long with that of President Diaz, has been proffered by the administration as a concession to the insurgents, declared today that the resignation of Diaz would never end the revolution.
"I do not intend to resign until I hear directly from General Diaz. My resignation would not settle the issue. I believe it is certain that the revolution will continue throughout the affected areas, at least in guerrilla form."

PRESIDENT MADERO WAS GOOD BOY SAYS FATHER; NEVER SPANKED IN LIFE

El Paso, May 18.—Elated at the victory of his son, who he believes will soon be the constitutional president of Mexico, Francisco Madero Sr. today lauded the boyhood of the insurrecto chief.
"If you had known my son when he was a boy," he said, "you never would have seen in him the leader of a successful revolution. He was always quiet and studious. He never fought with his playmates, and was never spanked in his life."

BINGER HERMANN BACK, HIS HEALTH RESTORED

Binger Hermann, ex-congressman and ex-commissioner of the general land office and the best known man in Oregon, is in Portland enroute to his home in Roseburg after an absence from the state of four months, during which he made an extended tour of the countries bordering on the Mediterranean Sea.
Mr. Hermann went abroad in search of health, and returned to his native land in splendid physical condition, declaring that he is enjoying better health than he has for many years.
"We sailed from New York February 4, direct for the Strait of Gibraltar," said the returned traveler, "and after entering the Mediterranean we stopped at every point of interest on the European, Asiatic and African coasts of that sea. Just four months' time was required to make the cruise with short side trips in Greece and Turkey, and a week's sail up the Nile as far as ancient Thebes."
Mr. Hermann was a willing talker on any subject but politics, although he spoke wistfully of a week's stay in Washington and recounted with an evident show of pleasure his meetings with old congressional friends.
"I have no aspirations to return to congress," said the Douglas county statesman, "and any announcement that I shall again be a candidate for the congressional nomination was entirely without my approval."
Mr. Hermann had no opinion to express on the Democratic free trade bill, in fact, he said that he had not read the bill and had paid no attention to the newspaper comment upon it. He leaves tonight for his home at Roseburg.

DISTRICT FIRMS ASK COMMISSION

Gas Light and Telephone Companies Want Public Utilities Regulating Body.

(Washington Bureau of The Journal.)
Washington, May 18.—The Washington Gas Light company and the Chesapeake & Potomac Telephone company, after years of bitter opposition have joined in indorsing the proposal to create a public utilities commission for the District of Columbia. The proposal emanated from progressive sources.
The demand for the creation of such a commission has been insistent for many years. To the surprise of the original proponents, these two public utility corporations have found that after all their own interests will be advanced by providing an official agency to settle disputes between the people and the corporations concerned.
Probably in no state conditions affecting public utility corporations are as chaotic as in the District of Columbia. The district is governed by three commissioners appointed by the president, but congress legislates directly for the district. The result is that a dozen committees in the house and senate are

FREEWATER-WALLA WALLA MACADAM ROAD PROPOSED

Walla Walla, Wash., May 18.—Construction of a macadam road from Walla Walla to Freewater was the main theme of discussion at the picnic of the Ferndale and Hudson Hay granges in Freewater. The rain and wind prevented the picnic being held outdoors, but the crowd gathered in the Odd Fellows temple. The Walla Walla-Freewater road may be jointly built by Umattila and Walla Walla counties.

Cookburn of Umattila county, whereby the county will pay half the labor and furnish the rock crusher, residents benefited to pay the other half. This plan met favor, and it was generally taken for granted that if the road is built to the state line, Walla Walla county will finish it.
