

**Baby Parade Feature of Baby Home Tag Day**



by a parade of the babies in the morning that it is expected will compete in attractiveness with the electric parade to be given Tuesday evening. At least three young women have consented to ride in the parade Tuesday morning and to sell tags during the day.

At headquarters, Seiling building, thousands of the tags are ready for sale at 10 cents each. They represent a baby peeping from a rose bud and constitute a striking souvenir of the rose festival and the festival spirit.

Mrs. D. C. Burns, president, and others connected with the Baby Home, have asked that the people of Portland and the visitors within the city show their generous disposition to aid misfortune and neglect this year as they have other years.

Many of the babies cared for at the home are considered as deserving of help as is Teddy, the half blind Baby Home waif, for whose education and care the kind-hearted people of the city have contributed money.

The tag day parade will be led by the Oak Grove band of 19 little girls, directed by Mr. Armstrong and Professor Driscoll.

Preparations for the parade Tuesday morning indicate that it will be a great success. The line of march will follow: From Baby home west on Division to Hawthorne to Hawthorne bridge; west on Madison to Seventh; north on Seventh to Burnside; east on Burnside to Sixth; south on Sixth to Morrison; east on Morrison to Fourth; north on Fourth to Washington; west on Washington to Tenth; south on Tenth to Salmon; east on Salmon to Third; north on Third to Stark; east on Stark to Front; south on Front to Madison.
