(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Grants Pass, Or., June 8.—C. L. Mangum and William Stock have just returned from Silver creek in the northwest part of Josephine county, 35 miles from Grants Pass, where they made one

of the most important strikes reported in several years. The name is to be the Old Glory mine. The report shows a high grade silicious quartz carrying 10 per cent copper and averaging \$100 per ton. The water power on the property is sufficient to operate a 100 stamp mill the entire year.
