

OFFICES AT DALLES NOT UNPOPULAR

List of Candidates Is Long; Commission Plan Likely to Be Rejected.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)
The Dalles, Or., June 9.—All the candidates to be voted for at the city election June 19, are now before the people, the date for filling petitions having expired. The candidates are:
For mayor—James H. Wood, Grant Hays, William H. Taylor.
For treasurer—E. Kurta, J. W. Elton.
Councillman first ward—Three years, L. A. Schanzler, Joe Kirchoff, two years, J. T. Rorick, H. Miller; one year, T. A. Hudson, Sam Davis.
Councillman second ward—F. L. Houghton, W. N. Wiley, F. M. Baker.
Councillman third ward—Three years, L. A. Schanzler, Joe Kirchoff, two years, J. W. Koontz, Dr. J. E. Anderson.
It is generally conceded that the charter amendment providing for a commission government will be defeated, owing to some provisions as to the selection of commissioners; therefore, the principal issue before the voters is the personnel of the candidates and the measures for which they stand. Of the candidates for mayor, Taylor is a socialist and is asking support on the strength of his party declaration, while neither of the other candidates is allied with a political party. Each stands for a better government; however, they have rather different views as to how reforms shall be brought out. Of the candidates for councilmen, some are for more rigid enforcement of the laws regulating the liquor traffic, while others favor no material change in the regulation of saloons. Regulation of disorderly houses also is concerned in the coming election and will likely become an issue before the election is over. Some demand that they be driven out of the city, while others insist that there should be a restricted district, while still others want to let these places remain as they are.

BRITISH SCIENTISTS EXPERIMENT ON PLANES

(United Press Leased Wire.)
London, June 9.—Contending that the human factor has to be relied upon too much in the use of all existing aeroplanes, the British war office today placed in the hands of a special scientific staff at the national physical laboratory a series of important tests in the development of military machines. The government is determined not to be outdone by France, Italy and other countries in encouraging airmen in the development of a type of aeroplane adapted to military requirements. Experiments will now be directed toward the production of a war aeroplane more automatically stable in flight than any biplane or monoplane now in military use.
