

TREATS BIBLE AS A BOOK OF LOGIC

Pastor Russell to Lecture To-
night at Armory on the
Book of Books.

In the opinion of Pastor Russell, who will lecture at the Armory tonight, the best and only cure for the widespread carelessness and infidelity regarding the Bible is to encourage advanced non-sectarian study of the book itself rather than a study of men's opinions and theories.

According to Pastor Russell many of the old theories regarding the Bible are now found untenable in the light of modern research. Many educated people have come to look upon the Bible as worthy of no more authority than any other well written book. As treated by him it becomes a book of logic and reason so that at every place he visits thousands crowd to hear him.

Pastor Russell arrived in the city this morning from Sacramento on his special train of eight cars. He is traveling as the guest of several hundred students of the International Bible Students' association, who are attending conventions in nearly all of the larger cities and several smaller ones. Pastor Russell is president of the association.

Conventions have been held at Cleveland, St. Louis, Kansas City, Denver, Salt Lake, Los Angeles, San Francisco, besides in several smaller cities. They have been very successful. At Los Angeles over 5000 people attended.

The convention in this city is being held at the Odd Fellows' hall, Sixth and Alder streets, and will be in session today and tomorrow. Many out of town Bible students are in attendance.

As Pastor Russell's visits to the west are not frequent, as many of the International Bible Students' associations are being visited on this tour as possible.

His sermons are published in 1200 papers in America and Europe, and reach about 12,000,000 people weekly.

reappoint Garfield, and retain Pinchot as mainstays of his conservation policies. During the first days of 1903, just before Taft entered the White House, Roosevelt learned that Garfield would not be reappointed, a council was held hurriedly and the Roosevelt contented, discovering that Ballinger was to succeed Garfield, determined it would withdraw lands in many localities from the public domain, placing them in the national forest reservations. Roosevelt remarked jocularly that "those lands

will be safe because they cannot get them out from the national forest without Pinchot's consent, and he never will consent, unless the public interest is safeguarded."

Prepared for withdrawal. Then ensued remarkable night by night conferences at the home of Pinchot, he, Garfield, Woodruff and others busying themselves with preparations for making an unprecedented withdrawal of lands and for placing them in the national forest.

Already Roosevelt had withdrawn lands to create the Chugach national forest on the south shore of Alaska, but it did not include the shores of Controller bay. Therefore among the last day withdrawals of Roosevelt was one adding to the boundaries of what is known as Controller bay.

These lands rested safe in the official charge of Pinchot, who therefore was the one obstacle to the syndicate in procuring the harbor. Ballinger had succeeded Garfield, and was in favor of whatever the syndicate wanted being given.

Pinchot in Way.

"If Pinchot were only ousted from the position of chief forester, our way would be clear," was what the syndicate men said. When Louis R. Glavis appealed to Pinchot to save the Cunningham coal claims and Pinchot wrote a letter to Senator Dilliver setting forth the truth, the administration thought it had adequate excuse for ousting Pinchot.

He was "fired," so that when on October 18, 1910, Taft signed his secret executive order reserving to public 15,000 acres on Controller bay's shores, Roosevelt's plans for using the harbor as a coaling station for the United States navy went a-glimmering. The harbor became the property of the Morgan-Guggenheim syndicate, and will become its permanent property unless pressure is brought to bear upon the executive department to refuse to confirm, first, the title to Ryan's claim on Controller bay shores, and to cancel the maps of the rights of way Ryan filed with the war department for his (the syndicate's) Controller Bay Railroad & Navigation company.

PANAMA-PACIFIC FAIR TO EXHIBIT AT ASTORIA

San Francisco, Cal., June 19.—President Charles C. Moore of the Panama-Pacific exposition, received Father John F. Waters, John Day and Harvey Allen, representing the Astoria Centennial committee and after a conference lasting most of the afternoon, decided to do everything possible to make the Panama-Pacific fair, August 18, a big event at the Oregon pageant.

President Moore is making personal representations to Governor Johnson and to various civic bodies urging them

to appoint special committees to cooperate with the Panama-Pacific exposition directors in working out the details of both rail and boat excursions to Astoria for the centennial.

The exposition executive issued orders for the collection of an exhibition of matter pertinent to the 1911 celebration. He has also accepted the offer of the Astoria Centennial committee to provide a headquarters at the centennial for the month it is in progress.

LIEUTENANT'S WIDOW WEDS COLONEL AMES

Sacramento, Cal., June 19.—The marriage of Lieutenant Colonel Robert F. Ames and Mrs. Madeline Janney, which occurred June 18, was made public today with the information that they are now in the east on a wedding journey. Mrs. Janney was the widow of Lieutenant C. W. Janney, who killed himself March 12, 1910, in the Philippines. The suicide occurred at the home of Colonel Ames, where the Janneys were dinner guests. A court martial exonerated Ames of any blame in connection with the affair.

The ceremony was performed by Rev. W. C. Sherman at the home of the bride's brother, R. T. McKelvie.
