

NEW SAWMILL TOWN WILL GET RAILROAD

Cherrygrove, the new sawmill town up the Willamette valley, will soon be connected with the west side line of the Southern Pacific. The Lovgren Lumber company, which is building a six mile branch from the Southern Pacific to the new town where its sawmill will be located, has completed grading the entire distance and a work

train will be run over the first two miles of steel tomorrow. The intention is to have the six miles completed by the end of July, when construction of a small and temporary mill will be commenced at Cherrygrove. A larger mill, with 250,000 feet capacity, will be located permanently to cut into material the large body of timber back of the proposed townsite. The branch is standard gauge and will carry freight and passenger cars. It will tap a well developed agricultural district for a distance of several miles before reaching the timber owned by the Lovgren Lumber company.
