

UMATILLA WILL RESUME WORK AT FIVE-MILE RAPIDS

Water Sufficiently Low to Permit Operations on Upper Columbia and Snake River Channels.

Water in the Snake river has dropped to a sufficient stage that the United States steamer Umatilla will be able to resume operations at Five Mile Rapids next week and Major Jay J. Morrow, corps of engineers, U. S. A., has given orders for Captain S. V. Winslow, master of the craft, to be in readiness to commence work Monday.

The steamer Umatilla, the steamer Wallawa and three drill screws which were doing channel work on the Snake and upper Columbia rivers were laid up last spring when the water became too high for them to work. Captain B. H. McManis with drill screw No. 2 has also been ordered to be in readiness to start work at Five Mile Rapids on July 17.

The steamer Wallawa on the Snake river and two drill screws on the Columbia will resume operations as soon as the water is low enough. The Wallawa may get out this morning but it is expected that the drill screws will be able to operate until early in August.

Good work was done in the channels of the upper Columbia and Snake rivers last year, the craft being engaged in scraping shoals, blasting dangerous rocks out of the channels and building small dams wherever necessary to put the channel in better shape. It is expected that this year the work done by the fleet will be much increased.

Great credit has been given to the United States engineers by navigators of the upper stretches of the Columbia and those that run from the mouth of the Snake to Lewiston for the work that has been done to improve those parts of the river in the last two or three years.

STANLEY DOLLAR DUE

Full Cargo of Freight From Eastern Points to Be Discharged Here.

A full cargo of freight from eastern points will be discharged here by the California Atlantic steamer Stanley Dollar, which sailed from San Francisco for this port at 3 o'clock yesterday afternoon and which should be due to arrive Saturday. For her outward cargo to Balboa she will take some salmon and lumber from this port and finish her cargo with lumber at Grays Harbor.

The steamer Navajo, of the same line, which sailed from Grays Harbor Tuesday for Balboa by way of San Francisco, had 1,350,000 feet of lumber from Portland and Aberdeen mills for New York, Philadelphia, Panama and Columbia and 300 tons of Columbia river salmon for New York. She will land 600 tons of machinery at San Francisco for Antofagasta.

BUILD NEW BRIDGE

To Be Constructed by St. Johns Firm for San Francisco Company.

The Standard American Dredging company of San Francisco, through its engineering engineer, A. S. Bruns, Jr., yesterday afternoon awarded to the St. Johns Shipbuilding company the contract to build the hull of a new dredger somewhat larger than that of the Turbine built last year by the same firm. The contract was for between \$19,000 and \$20,000 while the dredge complete will cost in the neighborhood of \$200,000. It will be 145 feet long, 40 feet beam and will have 12 feet 7 1/2 inches depth of hold. The two suction pipes will be 22 inches in diameter. It is expected to complete the hull in 90 days.

CHANNEL CONDITIONS GOOD

Soundings of the Willamette Show Month in Excellent Shape.

Captain Archie Pease, of the Columbia river pilots, who was on the Port of Portland tender Wenona yesterday when soundings were made of the Willamette river from the steel bridge to the mouth, said this morning that as a whole they found the channel in good condition while at the mouth of the river it was in particularly good shape. Some work, he says, will have to be done at Postoffice bar and the dredge Columbia will be taken to the upper end of the bar for that purpose. The

Laden with 600,000 feet of lumber the steamer Shoshone, Captain Asplund, will be at the custom house for San Pedro.

The lighthouse tender Heather will start north on a supply trip tomorrow delivering oil and other supplies to all of the light stations on the coast between the Columbia river and Puget Sound.

With a full list of passengers and all of the freight that she could carry the steamer Roanoke, Captain Jensen, sailed last night for San Francisco, Los Angeles and San Diego.

The steamer Breakwater, Captain Macginn, will be due to arrive this afternoon from Coos Bay with passengers and general freight.

Lightsip No. 50 will go on the Oregon drydock on a general cargo, hauling and whatever repairs are necessary.
