Weather Conditions.

The northwestern high pressure area has separated into two parts, one of which remains central over western Alaska and the other over the upper Missouri valley. The barometer continues relatively low in the southwest, but as yet this depression has not reached the coast. The amount of low pressure area of moderate intensity is passing to sea down the St. Lawrence valley. During the 24 hours thundershowers have occurred in the gulf and south Atlantic states and at widely separated places in the Mississippi and Ohio valleys. A maximum temperature of 91 degrees occurred yesterday afternoon in Portland, and it is the highest temperature that has occurred in this city so far this season. Temperatures this morning in the middle west are slightly below normal, but it is warmer than usual on the Pacific slope and in the Atlantic states as far south as Charleston. Indications are for fair weather in this district tonight and Friday, except in southern Idaho, where there will be thundershowers either tonight or Friday. It will be cooler Friday in all sections. Cooler tonight in the Willamette and lower Columbia valleys.

Ask \$600 Damages

Charging that they were intimidated by a policeman and a lawyer, three foreigners started suit today in the circuit court against L. A. Pickler and C. C.
