

COUPLE SAVED FROM DEATH BY DROWNING

A newly married couple, who refused to divulge their names, last night discovered that joy riding in canoes is nearly as disastrous and dangerous as it is in an automobile. The couple own one of these tricky, homemade canoes, and started out in the boat from the Favorite boathouse at the foot of

Morrison street where they store it about 8 o'clock last night. The steamer Diamond O, with two barges was approaching the Morrison bridge and the canoeists turned in behind to enjoy riding the big rollers.

Owing to the tows, the rollers were larger and more uneven than usual and they had been among them only for a few seconds when the canoe tipped over. A. S. Imhoff, engineer on the launch Olympic, jumped in a rowboat and started the rescue. Before he reached them the waves had gone over the couple several times as they held on to the canoe and the woman was badly frightened, calling for help and frantically waving to the people on the bridge in an effort to get them to come

to her rescue. After a short struggle, Imhoff managed to get both safely into the boat and took them to the boathouse.

EUGENE MAN DROWNS TRYING TO SAVE FRIEND

Baldwin and wife, residing at 826 Emerald avenue, that their son, Guy, was drowned near Stevensville, Mont., last Sunday, and that the body is now on the way to Eugene for burial. The funeral will be held Friday. He was out fishing with

a companion named Richard Sleeman. Sleeman got into deep water and Baldwin in trying to save him was unable to reach the shore again. Both were drowned. Baldwin was aged 22 years and went to Montana a year ago.

Lowell Boys Hurt by Horses.

(Special to The Journal.) Eugene, Or., July 20.—Harvey McFarland, a youth of Lowell, Or., was injured in a runaway yesterday. He was sitting on the seat of a hay rake in front of the blacksmith shop at Lowell, when one of the horses got its bridle off and the team began to run. It ran through a barn nearby, thence out through a field and against a barbed

wire fence, one of the horses breaking a leg. Young McFarland clung to the rake during the wild flight but when the collision with the fence took place was thrown into the midst of the wreck and received abrasions and bruises. A few minutes afterward Harvey Cain, a friend of the McFarland boy, was kicked in the side by a horse exactly where McFarland's hay rake was standing before the horses ran away, and suffered two broken ribs.

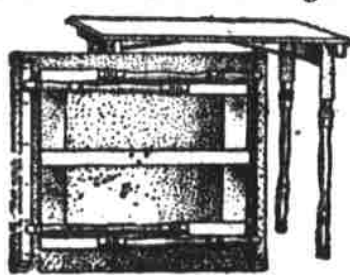

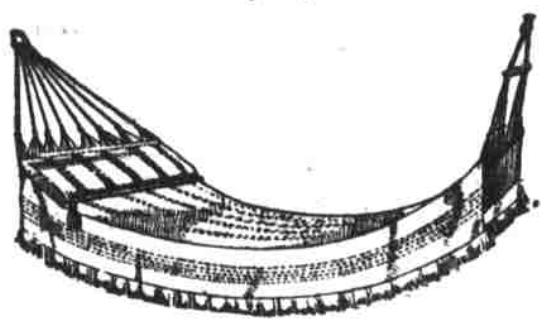
