Construction of House to Cost at Least Half Million Dollars Hailed as Boon to Cattle Interests.

"Our new packing plant at Portland will be completed within six months," said Lehman Levy, general construction engineer for Schwarzschild & Sulzberger, this morning, who has been in the city for the past two days looking over the site recently purchased by the company.

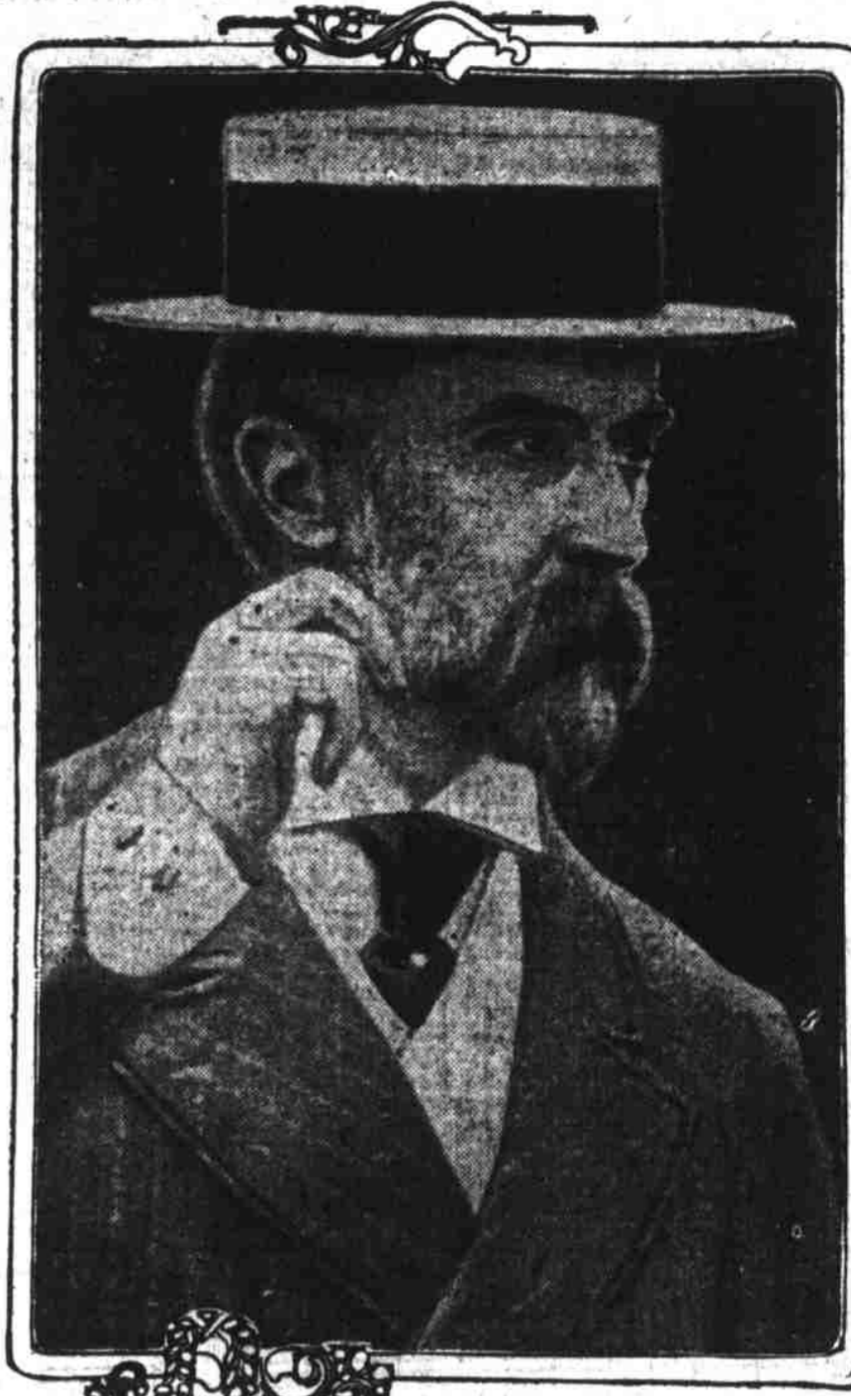
"I have not seen the site for the new plant but once, but I find it admirably situated and we will begin actual construction just as soon as the plans are completed, which will be within a very short time.

"We will expend more than half a million dollars," continued Mr. Levy. "Probably the cost of the plant will reach \$600,000. GUN PERIL MENACE TO HUMAN LIFE; MEDIUM FOR COMMISSION OF CRIME

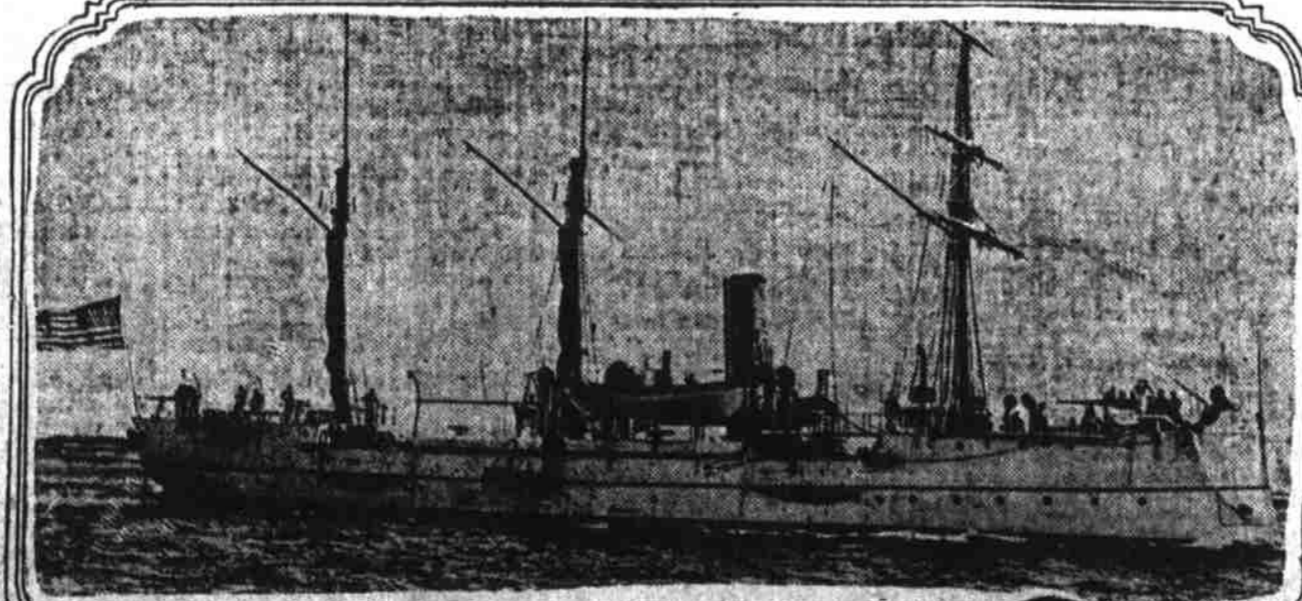
