

KOZER RESIGNS; IS TO BECOME STATE SECRETARY DEPUTY

Insurance Commission Goes to J. W. Ferguson of Portland, Expert Accountant; Change Relieves Olcott

(Salem Bureau of The Journal.)
Salem, Or., Sept. 15.—Two important changes in state officials were announced today. S. A. Koser has resigned as insurance commissioner and accepted the position of deputy secretary of state, to succeed H. H. Corey, who left the office of chief clerkship three months ago.

Koser will be succeeded as insurance commissioner by J. W. Ferguson of Portland, who will be officially appointed by Governor West. Ferguson is secretary of the state Democratic committee and is an expert accountant, having just finished investigations into the defunct Vancouver bank. He was Multnomah county's representative in the investigation of the Oregon Trust & Savings bank at the time when Olcott represented Governor Chamberlain in straightening out that muddle. Prior to Olcott's appointment as secretary of state he and Ferguson had formed a partnership in the accounting business.

Koser an Astoria Man.
Sam A. Koser was tendered and accepted the position of deputy secretary of state more than four months ago. To accept it he has, upon Secretary Olcott's solicitation, tendered his resignation as insurance commissioner to the governor. Mr. Koser's residence is Astoria. He was appointed in January, 1909, 12 years ago as auditor in the office of secretary of state by Secretary of State F. L. Dunbar. In 1907 Secretary of State Frank W. Benson promoted him to the position of chief clerk. He filled this position until March, 1909, at which time he was ap-

pointed by Governor Benson to his present position of insurance commissioner. Olcott has done the work.
Mr. Koser is, by education, training and experience, perhaps the best qualified man in Oregon for the position he assumes Monday next, at which time Oregon will have, for the first time, a deputy secretary of state. For the past three months Olcott has personally served in the dual capacity of secretary of state and chief clerk, and in doing so has effected a saving to the taxpayers of something like \$1000. To do this, he has been compelled to work long hours. It has taken practically all his evenings and Sundays. His chief object was his desire to get thoroughly acquainted and in direct touch with the innermost details of the office.

"If it were not for the heavy demands upon my time for the consideration of board matters," said Olcott today, "I would continue to dispense with the services of a chief clerk or deputy, but on account of many important state matters now in charge of the board, I find it inexpedient to do so."


