

WOULD HAVE FIXED PRICES FOR PAVING

In an opinion addressed to the street committee of the executive board, City Attorney Grant advised the board to enter into an agreement with each of the paving companies that lay out streets, stipulating that the companies shall supply paving material at fixed prices. The city will be compelled to maintain a great many miles of pavements in the future and the city attorney advises that an arrangement of the nature suggested should be entered into in order to prevent the companies from charging exorbitant prices. Three other opinions, more or less important, were filed by the city attorney today. One of these was the city engineer who repair sewers that are necessary for the proper drainage of a

street at the expense of the street repair fund. Manufacturers sewer repairs have been charged to the general fund. The application of the city attorney's advice will save the general fund thousands of dollars annually. That a resolution introduced in the city council by Councilman Clyde, to provide that property may not be assessed for paving improvements beyond the appraised value of the property would only add needless expense to the auditing department and would be ineffective, in the substance of another opinion. The regular amendment to the charter prohibits the selling by the city of any of its real property. Such is the important portion of another opinion requested by the city health board, which wished to dispose of the old post houses.

MAYOR IS ASKED TO CRUSH SMALL REVOLT

It became necessary today for City Building Inspector H. E. Plummer to

call upon Mayor Haight to suppress an embryo revolt that has been coming among the deputies in the building inspection department for some time. As a result of Mr. Plummer's call Deputy City Building Inspector J. H. Letet was instructed by the mayor to get a check. One of the rules of the building inspector's office is that deputies shall make a detailed report of all inspections. Each report must name the hour and date at which the inspection was made. "Deputy Letet has been careless in making out his reports," said Mr. Plummer this morning. "He has turned in cards without specifying the hour of inspection. I told him some time ago to be more specific." The city building inspector believes that a clique of his deputies has been organized to "oust" him from the position. More than a month ago he filed charges with the mayor against Deputy W. K. Beavie, but the mayor has taken no action, pending the holding of examinations by the civil service commission

to secure eligibles for a number of positions. The new inspectors will be in the building inspection department. OREGON EXHIBITS LEAVE FOR THE EAST An express car loaded with fruit and vegetable products of Lane, Linn, Marion and Benton counties will leave on the Southern Pacific for Omaha tonight, and will form a part of the Oregon exhibit of the Harriman lines at the Omaha land show. The land show is to open October 14, and will remain open until the 28th. Last year the exhibit of Oregon farm and orchard products was especially fine, and attracted much attention. This year the Willamette valley counties are to be given advantageous space for showing their products. The four counties mentioned have gathered samples of grain, fruits and vegetables, and the railroad furnished a car for their transportation to the show.

LYMAN UNDER \$25,000 BONDS; FUGITIVES SEEN

Klamath Falls, Or., Oct. 3.—Dr. Grant Lyman, held under bond of \$25,000, will be taken to Portland as soon as the federal officers get through with the case in connection with the sailing of liquor on the Klamath Indian reservation. They will probably leave here Friday morning. The five escaped prisoners hiding in the mountains east of here called at a farm house Tuesday night for shelter and food. They disclosed their identity and seemed ready to give up. All were together, but only L. B. Thorne, Lyman's name, and Hill, called at the house. The sheriff and deputies are on the trail.
