Sacrey Hotel Scene of Attempt of Incendiary; Kerosene Is Scattered Promiscuously Through Rooms.

MAN AND WIFE HELD FOR ATTEMPTED ARSON

Message Saying Daughter Ill Believed by Police to Have Prompted Act.

Mr. and Mrs. F. E. Uim of 545 1/2 First street were arrested at an early hour this morning on a charge of arson, in connection with an alleged attempt on their part to burn the furniture which they own in the Harvey hotel, at the above number.

Kerosene was found in every room, saturating the carpets, beds and couches, and in rooms where gas meters were located, hoses that had been attached to the stoves were removed and placed under the oil soaked beds, and when the fires were being fought last night all these were found to be lighted.

DEFENSE TO MAKE NO EFFORT TO GET CHANGE OF VENUE

Claarence Darrow to Content Himself With Formal Motion for Different Judge, Which Will Be Denied.

Los Angeles, Oct. 10.—There will be no effort made by the attorneys for the McNamara brothers to secure a change of venue for them when their trial is formally moved before Judge Bordwell at 10 o'clock tomorrow morning.

The defense will then make the formal motion for separate trials and it will be put up to the district attorney to elect which of the pair shall go to trial. It is well nigh certain that James B. McNamara, accused of having actually set off a dynamite bomb under the old Times building, will be the first to face a jury. He will be retained in court, while John J. McNamara, the noted labor leader, will be taken back to jail to await his turn.
