DUCK BLINDS MUST BE WITHIN BOUNDS

Attorney General Crawford Says 100 Ft. From Water is Limit.

Hundreds of duck hunters in the state of Oregon have been appealing to State Game Warden Finley during the past few weeks for information regarding the placing of blinds and he in turn asked Attorney General Crawford for an official opinion.

The law reads as follows: "It shall be unlawful for any person to build or use any blind, or any other structure in any public lake or river in the state of Oregon, or in the Columbia river, or in any lake in the state of Oregon, which is not wholly owned by himself, his lessor or licensee, which stands more than the 100 feet out from the shore or margin of such lake or river, for the purpose of shooting wild ducks, geese, swan or other water fowl therefrom at any time.
