COMMISSION PLAN COMMITTEES MEET

The possibility of getting the work done by the people's and citizen charter commissions so that but one set of commission plan amendments may be submitted to the people next January will be determined at a joint meeting of special committees from the two commissions with a committee from the council in the city hall at 1:30 p. m. tomorrow.

A meeting was called for yesterday afternoon. It was attended by A. E. Clark, Dr. C. J. Chapman and Richard W. McManis from the people's committee and Councilman Baker, Jennings and Schaefer.

The citizen commission was unrepresented for the reason that until last night its meeting of the commission had been held. The citizen commission will be represented tomorrow and the people's commission special committee has agreed to come back.

At the meeting of the citizen commission last night 11 members were present. Judge Carl C. Bronaugh presided and an chairman of a special committee on charter draft submitted 118 complete sections with proposed amendments adapted to commission plan government.

As far as possible it was agreed by the commission that the present charter shall remain unchanged. The sections relating to streets and finance and taxation will receive but minor changes to accord with commission plan government, which is a government by the commission of five members in place of the council, the executive board, the park, auditorium, water, health and other boards.
