

BUTTER MARKET IS TO SHOW ADVANCE

Market Here Much Firmer Since Sharp Rise in East; Outside Make Smaller.

Conflicting prices in the butter trade are the cause of much comment in the local market at this time. While the price of butter has recently advanced...

As a result of the much stronger tone in the butter trade at eastern and middle west centers, the prospects are encouragingly bright for a sharp advance in the local market.

When through the make of butter here has increased since the fall, the market is in a better position to handle a demand which is not surprising if a cent or two were added to the present quotation during the present week.

There remains a very liberal supply of fresh cream in the wholesale fish market and sales are being made from \$1 to \$1.50 per dozen, according to quality.

Oyster trade decreased. Owing to the very high prices asked for local oysters, trade has advanced materially from that of last season.

Coffee up another cent. Some of the leading local roasters today advanced the price of coffee a cent.

Dressed hogs very weak. Much weakness is shown in the dressed hog trade along Front street.

Hop trade is quiet. Trade in the hop market is quiet today being a legal holiday.

Eggs are holding firm. With most sales of local fresh ranch eggs at \$4 a dozen, the front street market is firmer.

Forecast for shippers. Protect shipments as far north as Seattle against minimum temperatures of about 48 degrees.

Poultry market weak. While showing no change in prices, the poultry market remains weak along Front street.
