Shows Wiedom of Parts. The president discussed the funding of the debt of the Dominican republican as an instance of the wiedom of such arrangements. He said in part:

We have heard a great deal during the past six months in favor of general arbitration treaties for the prem the peace of the world. I believe there has been of late more genuine exion of sentiment among all the peode of the earth for peace than ever be-bre in the world's history. The cravfor some effective means of promoting peace grows not so much out of war as out of the desperation with which the great nations are increasing the stupendous burden of ar-miles and armament, making Europe an ed camp, with the growing menace

of bankruptey. The fact is that we have had very little war in the last 25 years, and one of the reasons has been the rivalry in preparation for war and the certainty of financial disaster to some nations which must follow.

Arbitration Best Means.

"Among these great nations there is the conservatism of domestic stabil-Universal treaties of arbitration for such countries are of the highest importance as probably furnishing a means by which all may be in-duced ultimately to reduce their armaments, when it shall become apparent that arbitration is a real and practical substitute for war.

"I would not therefore minimize the rtance of such treaties in the ultimate cause of peace; but I wish to point out that at present wars chiefly arise, not between well ordered nations having well armed, well recruited and well siplined forces, but out of internecine strife. They grow out of the rebellion or revolution of part of a people against the constituted authority of the other part. They proceed from the lack of stability of government and cupidity and the ambition of partisan leaders among the people. There are countries where the occupation of a revolutionist has become a profession and the unhappy common people are driven into guerfills warfare for more self protection.

"Starvation succeeds plenty in countries as productive as any in the world. The institutions of civil liberty, if they ever were inaugurated under a high sounding constitution, cease to exist, revolutions follow each other in rapid succession, the finances of the government are in hopeless confusion, and it is a stretch of the imagination to call

Peace has prevailed: capital has entered after peace; enterprise has followed, and prosperity is the result. We had spent hundreds of thousands of dollars each year in sending fleets of gunboats to protect American and foreign property in Santo Domingo and Haiti against injury from revolutions. Now that source of expense has been reduced to a minimum. Our responsibility, so far as armed interference is concerned, has practically disappeared.

"The lesson of Santo Domingo has suggested a similar solution of the dif-ficulties of Honduras, Nicaragua, and some of the other countries in Central America. There have been, as I say, seven revolutions in 15 years in Hon-Her debt, the principal of which was originally \$25,000,000, in bonds, has increased by accrued interest to \$124,-000,000, and her military expenditures each year are \$600,000. The government has no money with which to make improvements, to build roads, to do any of the things necessary to progress and civilization. Taft Train, En Route to Sacramento Cal., Oct. 13.-Invading California for the most strenuous four days of his 46 day trip, President Taft today endeavored to secure a good rest to prepare himself for the ordeal. While the president, with the exception of a slightly strained throat, was in good trim physically, two members of his party were slightly under the weather. Private ecretary Charles D. Hilles was confined to his stateroom on the train with a bad nervous headache, the result of four weeks' of campaigning. Hilles spent all of yesterday in his room with Dr. Rhoads, the president's physician attending him. He is expected to be back in condition by the time he reaches

The ceremonial outfit of Major Archbald Clavering De Grafenreid Butt, A. D. C., today covered a suffering body. The major, in his round of gold laced functions in the past four weeks, some-where contracted what Dr. Rhoads calls an attack of "hives."
