The most alarming tendency, in my judgment, as far as our institutions are concerned, is the tendency toward delay. When men of vast interests are concerned and they cannot get lawmakers to enact amendments to the law as they desire, they spare no effort to get some case before the court in an effort to have the court construe the constitution and statute to mean what they want it to mean.

Justice Harlan was 4 feet 11 inches in height and in his prime weighed 300 pounds. He seemed to weaken from last spring, when he went on a vacation to Murray Bay, Canada. He returned two weeks ago, very weak but not suffering from any special ailment.

John Marshall Harlan took his seat on the supreme court bench December 10, 1877, after a long period of active public life. He was born in Boyle county, Ky., June 1, 1833, and at the age of 17 he came to this country.
