#### SPRINGFIELD WOULD CONTROL LIQUOR TRAFFIC

(Special to The Journal.)
Springfield, Or., Oct. 20.—On the assumption that "home rule" will carry at the city election November 7. advocates of the saloon have already had Attorney DePue draft a license law for the city, to be adopted if the voters approve saloons. Among the provisions are these: There must be no screens at the windows, no tables nor chairs; no games, not even dice; no side or back entrances; Sunday closing and closing at reasonable hours on week days.

The license is fixed at not less than \$1000 a year, and the second violation of regulations would work revocation of the license. 
