

FUNERAL OF AGED PIONEER IS HELD

The funeral of Mrs. David F. Kinsey, known and loved by many of the pioneers as "Grandma" Kinsey, was held this afternoon from the residence of her son, Charles G. Kinsey, 445 East Portland street, north. The services were conducted by "Father" Flynn, the pioneer Methodist minister whose church Mrs. Kinsey attended in the early sixties, assisted by Dr. Benjamin Young, of the Taylor Street Methodist church. Interment was in Rose City Park cemetery.

Mrs. Kinsey's death occurred Wednesday evening at 7 o'clock. She had been ill for some time. She was over 75 years of age.

With her husband she crossed the plains in 1862, being on the trip from May 8 to September 25. They settled in La Grande where Mr. Kinsey built the first two-story frame house which became known everywhere as a refuge for all travelers. At that time there were but few cabins at La Grande.

Mr. Kinsey was the first treasurer of Union county which, extended from The Dalles, to the Snake river and was appointed by Governor Gilibe. He also started the first Sunday school in La Grande and was a member of the first lodge of I. O. O. F. in the Grande Ronde valley.

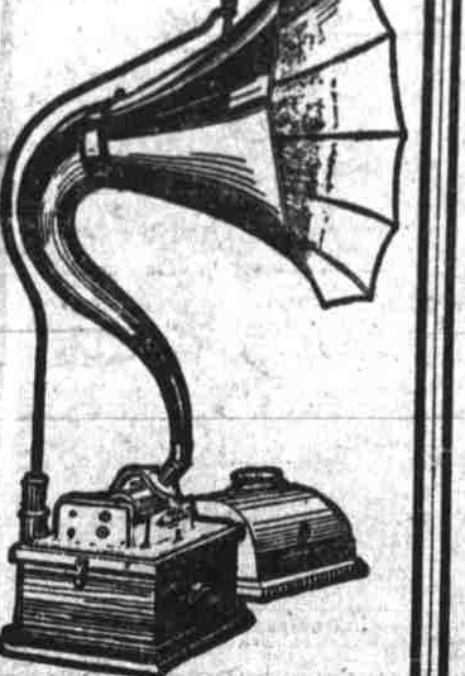
Mrs. Kinsey is survived by her widower, 80 years of age, 3 children, all residents of Portland, 15 grandchildren and 3 great-grandchildren. All were with her at the time of her death. The Care of the Bathroom Closet
In the bathroom the closet requires constant attention and frequent, thorough scrubbing. Rinse the seat and flush freely. Put into the bowl of the closet a handful of Gold Dust washing powder and let the solution stand for some time. Then take an old broom and scrub all the parts that can be reached, especially into the traps as far as possible. Flush again and add more of the washing powder and wash under the flushing rim and all parts inside and out. Stains of iron from the water if not removed by the scrubbing may be removed with a few drops of hydrochloric acid.
