WHAT DECISION

Men Who Will Determine Winner of Auditorium Drawings Inspect Plans.

Construction utility and appearance will be three determining features in awarding the plan for the public auditorium to one of the 62 architects whose drawings are displayed on the second floor of the Bell building.

The jury of awards consisting of E. L. Lawrence, Portland; Kirk C. Carter, Spokane; and Willie Park, San Francisco, will be able to view every plan and compare the merits of the drawings on October 21. The program requires an announcement of the winner by November 1.

What would be the space of three rooms to be used in the Bell building for the exhibit of the plans. Each plan consists of four sheets, showing in detail the front elevation, the auditorium, committee room, hall, entrance, arrangement of seats, etc.

The plan which receives the award will not, however, necessarily dictate the form of the auditorium when built. The successful architect will enter into conference with the auditorium committee as to the nature of building which will be adapted to Portland's needs.

The site of the auditorium, yet to be determined, will have large influence upon the character of the structure. With improvement organizations led by the Home City Park Improvement club, interested for the site of the old exposition building as the proper place for the auditorium, with the original auditorium committee, from the Commercial club, the City Improvement league and other organizations in favor of the exposition building site, it is believed that a decision as to the site of the auditorium will be reached in time to prevent embarrassing delay when the award is made.

He also said that he was perfectly willing to lay aside his opinion and try the case fairly on the law and the evidence, but Judge Bordwell ruled that inasmuch as he had advised several former miners regarding the state's dynamite and discovery from their replies that there were no developments in connection with the Times disaster such as always follow the detonation of dynamite or high explosives, he had made an "independent investigation" and so was ineligible.

Easley said he examined the steel tank from the wrecked Times building and was satisfied that it showed traces of having been twisted by a high explosive force. He said, however, that he could lay aside his opinion and the defense passed him for cause. District Attorney Fredericks was apparently disturbed over this action and promptly challenged Easley on the defense's interjection.

Fredericks is Sanctioned. "This juror has absolutely disqualified himself," said Fredericks, "as he made a personal investigation of the case."
