

ALL BOARDS TO BE ABOLISHED AFTER 6 MONTHS IS PLAN

Various City Commissions, Under New Plan of Government, to Be Retained Till System in Working Order.

A provision for the abolition of all boards and commissions other than the executive and legislative commission of five under the commission form of government was made by the people's charter revision committee meeting last night in the city hall.

An effort of the radical wing of the committee to have all such boards and commissions disposed of as soon as the commission plan became effective was defeated, and it was provided that they should be abolished within six months after the meeting of the commission. It was also provided that the commission might appoint other boards and commissions if it was so desired, having consultative power to change the personnel. The order of last night does not apply to the library board. It is proposed that it remain as it is, except that under the commission plan the city will have a representative on the board appointed by the commission.

The committee approved, last night, the establishing of public markets, public lavatories and the extension of the play park system.

To Continue Civil Service.

Provision was made for the continuation of the civil service system of appointments in city service, adapted to the commission plan.

It was stated that two more meetings would complete hearing of all reports of subcommittees and that then work might be concentrated on codification and revision. Next week the committee expects to meet several times in order to expedite the filing of the commission plan charter by November 9 so that it may be voted on at the special election, January 2.

The direct effect upon the employ-

ment of all concerned with city work makes the civil service provisions of special interest. The report as approved for incorporation in the commission plan charter by the people's committee last night is as follows:

Civil Service Board.

"There is hereby established a civil service board, consisting of three members.

"The board shall be elected after the adoption of this charter shall, as soon as practicable thereafter, appoint one member of said commission to serve for two years, another member to serve for four years and a third member to serve for six years. Successors thereafter shall be appointed by the commission to take the place of the member whose term shall next expire so that one member shall be appointed every two years to serve for a period of six years. If a vacancy shall occur in the commission it shall be filled by appointment by the council for the unexpired term.

"Section 3. Each member of the civil service board shall receive \$4 per day when attending meetings of the civil service commission, provided, however, that such salary shall not exceed \$30 per month.

"Section 4. No employee under civil service shall engage in any employment other than that for which he or she is employed by the city, and they shall not be allowed to enter competition with any trade or occupation in which he or she receives compensation or remuneration of any kind, public or private, for any services rendered other than the regular salary allowed by the city.

"Sec. 5.—Preference in employment: Qualified applicants shall be employed in preference to non-applicants, and smarted men and men with families in preference to unsmarted men, and such preference shall extend to ranking upon the eligible list of the board, provided, however, that this section shall apply only to day laborers and shall not apply to positions requiring technical skill or scientific knowledge.

"Sec. 6.—The board shall, with the approval of the council, make such rules and regulations for the proper conduct of its business as it shall find necessary or expedient. The board shall, among other things, provide for the classification of all employments in all the departments of the city of Portland, for tests, competitive and free examinations as to fitness; for an eligible list from which vacancies shall be filled; for a period of probation before employment is made permanent; and for promotion on the basis of merit, seniority and record.

Removals for Cause.

"Sec. 7.—No employee in the classified civil service who shall have been per-

manently appointed under the provisions of this article shall be removed or discharged except for cause, as herein stated, in general terms, shall be served upon him or her and a duplicate filed with the board. Any employee so removed may within ten days from his removal file with the commission a written demand for investigation. If such demand shall allege, or if it shall otherwise appear to the commission that the discharge or removal was for political or religious reasons or was not in good faith, for the purpose of improving the public service, the investigation shall be conducted by the commission for that purpose. acted by the commission may be considered and further rights, duties and privileges as may be necessary admitted to enforce and carry out the principles of civil service.

"Sec. 8. No subordinate or unskilled laborer and a citizen of the United States, who has not declared his intention to become such, and who has not resided within the city for one year next before entering thereon, shall be employed by the city. Eight hours shall constitute a day's work for all laborers, workmen and mechanics who may be employed by the city, and the minimum wage of unskilled manual laborers employed by the city shall be \$1 per day.

JAPANESE WOUNDS MOTION PICTURE CHIEF; KILLS AIDE

played as a gardener and janitor in the motion picture development plant, without warning burst through the door. He held a huge army revolver in his hand. Without a word he opened fire with deadly effect. The first shot brought down the chief, the next two bullets struck effect in Bell's body, one piercing his arm, the other lodging in the head.

The occupants of the room overpowered the Japanese and he was arrested. He is believed insane. Bell was rushed to a local hospital, where it was said that his condition is critical.

Following a careful examination of Bell's injuries at the St. Peter's hospital, it was announced at noon today that the Chicagoan would recover. The ac-

tion probably saved the lives of Muller, Marshall and Roseworth. While one arm shattered by a bullet being grabbed momentarily by the chief, the Japanese brought the butt end of his revolver down on Bell's head with all his force and Bell sank unconscious to the floor.

Bell's head was badly cut and bruised. Muller, Marshall and Roseworth rushed to Bell's aid and the Japanese was quickly overpowered.

Bugge died instantly. The bullet sped clean through his body and imbedded itself in the wall.

The Japanese refused to make any statement after the shooting. The police say that he has been drinking heavily. Two months ago, the Japanese while under the influence of liquor attacked an employe of the motion picture company and was discharged. He was taken back to work only a week ago.
