Dashes Sixty-five Yards for Only Touchdown of the Pullman Game.

Pullman, Wash., Oct. 28.—Starting the first big college game of the year yesterday, Captain Bill Maa, the star of the Maa team, played the best game of his career...

Washington state had a bit better of the rushing game, keeping the ball in the visitors' territory for the greater part of the four sessions. The plays were always slow and ground was made to negotiate.

Early in the game the Oregonians began their forward passing, but kept most of their plays under cover because several of the University of Washington coaches and players were on the sidelines analyzing their style of play.

A dance was held in honor of the visitors last night and as nobody was injured in the scrimmage the affair was thoroughly enjoyed.

A brief analysis shows that Oregon made 190 yards during the game, while W. S. C. averaged 31 yards. Latoro, etc for Oregon punter, 18 times for 540 yards, overshadowing the kicking of Coulter, who booted for an aggregate of 245 yards in 15 tries.
