Wealth and Power For Day Laborer

ZEALAND LABORER BECOMES EARL OF SEAFIELD BY WILL

Rise of Nobleman From Station of Penniless Laborer to One of Wealth Reads Like Romance.

The International News Service. London, Oct. 28.—From the position of a humble day laborer in New Zealand to being the possessor of an annual income of \$100,000, the career of Earl of Seafield is a story of a strange romance.

Although the earl got his title as long ago as 1893, they acquired him only in New Zealand, a practically penniless laborer, who held the title for only a few months, was a court favorite in Ottawa, New Zealand, and his mother was a Salvation Army lass.

The fact that during recent years the earl has been numbered among England's landless lords, is because when the eighth earl died leaving no children, all the property reverted to the late dowager countess.

The best known of the many estates now owned by the earl is Balmuccia, near Inverness, leased for the past few days to Bradley Martin of New York and the son of Frederick Townsend.

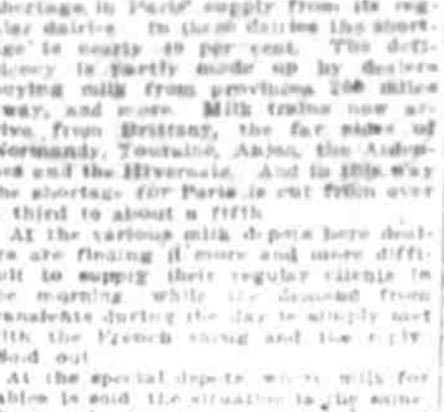
