B. F. DOWELL TO BE NEW FIRE CHIEF; THREE CANDIDATES

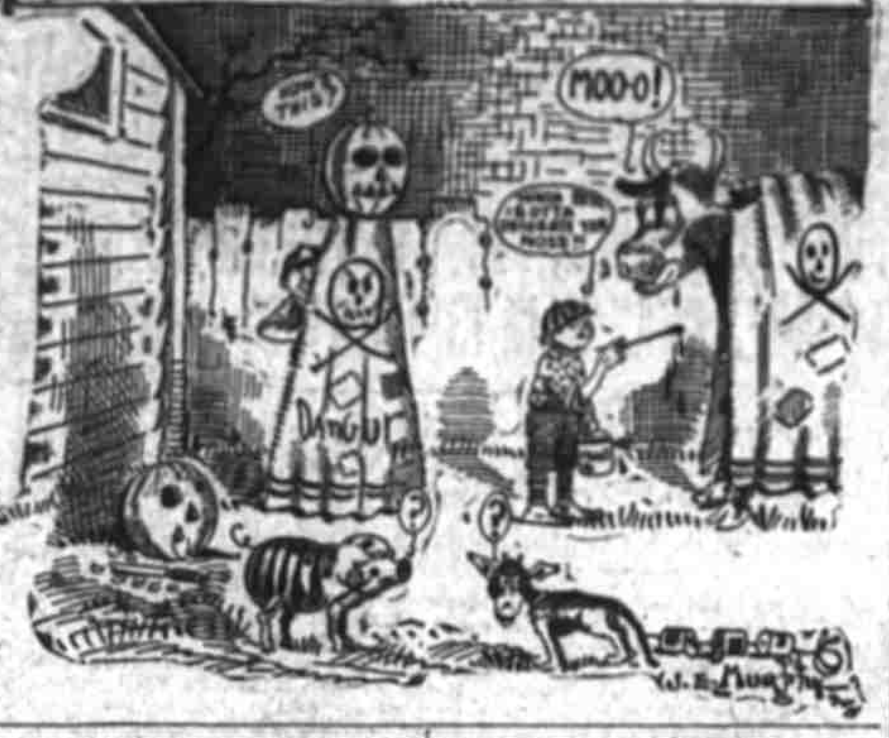
Appointment Pleasing to the Members of Department—New Chief to Take Office Tomorrow Morning.

(United Press Leased Wire.) New York, Oct. 21.—Hundreds of thousands of people lined the shores of the Hudson river today to witness the assemblage of the greatest fighting fleet ever gathered in United States waters.

(United Press Leased Wire.) Trieste, Oct. 21.—Italy has seized and occupied the Turkish islands of Rhodes and Lesbos, according to Milan dispatches. It is believed that this is part of the naval demonstration threatened against Turkey in retaliation for the recent Tripoli successes.
