

PORTLAND BOOSTERS TO AID PROJECT OF DEVELOPING BACKWARD COUNTIES IN EASTERN OREGON

TRADE EXCURSION VISITS ARLINGTON, FORTY TAKE TRIP

Business Men and Publicity Experts Join in Plan to Develop Backward Counties—Demonstration Train.

With an enthusiasm that thrilled, 40 business men went from Portland this morning to the Sherman-Morrow-Gilliam development convention at Arlington. They will remain two days helping the people of the 4000 square miles to solve their production and population problems, and then return to Portland, reaching here at 1 o'clock tomorrow evening.

No formal program is set for the first meeting of the convention this afternoon. As much as possible it is planned by the tri-county development committee that organized the excursion, to have the residents of the three backward counties themselves do the talking.
