

FIGHT FOR RECALL WILL BE FOUGHT OUT IN ARIZONA

People Must Drop Pet Measure
to Get Statehood, but Legis-
lature Pledged to Submit an
Amendment.

On November 13, when Arizona votes to adopt a state constitution without the recall of judges, she will also elect a legislature pledged to submit the recall of judges as an amendment to the constitution at the earliest practical date.

This is the prediction of Judson King, field secretary of the National Referendum league, who was in Portland yesterday, but left last night to assist in the Arizona fight. He travels here, there, and elsewhere, wherever the fight for direct legislation is hottest. Having taken part in the California struggle he feels greatly encouraged for the Arizona fray.

"The people of the new state are going to do a peculiar thing," said Mr. King. "To obtain statehood, they will have to comply with President Taft's wishes and leave the recall of judges out of the constitution. But on the same day they will vote for members of the first legislature, which is certain to contain a large majority pledged to submit the recall of judges as soon after they are in office. Arizona will get statehood on the conditions laid down by Taft, then will do as it pleases."

LAWYER SCORES JUDGE TAZWELL

Artist Rapped for Naming Max
Cohen to Take His Place
on the Bench.

A strong protest was made last evening before the Multnomah bar association against the recent appointment of Attorney Max Cohen to preside at the municipal court in the absence of Municipal Judge Tazwell. Attorney Julius Silvestro brought up the subject, declaring the bar association should give some attention to making its voice, as well as making war on a few "non-graduate classes."

"The city recently witnessed the sad spectacle of a judge recommending a certain man to take his place. He is a man who was utterly unfit for the place of municipal judge of a city like Portland. I must vigorously protest against such an act. It was wrong to make such a recommendation to the mayor; it was a shame for the mayor to make the appointment. I further claim that a judge who will recommend such a man places himself in that man's class. I protest against such work. I hope the association will take some action in the matter."

Attorney Silvestro further added that the association should take up a recent case in the court of Justice of the Peace Olson where the judge scored Leonard T. Lewis for taking fees from both sides and charging for services not rendered.

A resolution changing the constitution of the association to allow prosecution of attorneys not members of the association, was introduced by a special committee. The idea is to have charges against attorneys heard by an investigating committee or grand jury and that if a true bill is found the accused should be given a trial before the chancellor.

The amendments were primarily made to handle complaints against attorneys who have been "skating on this ice," as expressed by the chairman of the association. One complaint in particular charges an attorney with following a man injured by a streetcar to the hospital to induce him to start a personal injury case against the car company. A complaint has been made to the association that there are six men practicing law who have not been admitted to the bar.

Attorneys W. E. Gilson, Frank E. Miller, A. L. Hammarby and Will B. King were admitted to the association as new members.

Reasons for Recall.
"I believe there are two reasons why the recall of judges has been made such a large issue. In the first place, the judge is the power behind which there is no appeal, and in the second place the bench is the last resort of privileges."

"The last remnant of the doctrine of the divine right of kings clings to the bench. The great interests have been accustomed to rely upon this last bulwark, and they are making a last stand to keep the judges immune from the people."

"The people are marching on, just the same. The initiative and referendum will be submitted next in Washington, North Dakota and Wisconsin, and the initiative in Nevada. An abortive form of the initiative is to be submitted in Idaho and Wyoming."

"In Ohio the progressives are hard at work, and it will be a hot fight. That is my home state. Although the Democratic platform upon which Harmon was elected governor declared for direct legislation, the governor has never said a word for it. There is nothing in his speeches, nothing in his messages. He is not in favor of it."

"The interests will be well satisfied with Harmon. As they now foresee that Taft is likely to lose if a progressive Democrat is nominated, and may even lose the nomination to La Follette, they are preparing to get behind Harmon and make him the Democratic nominee."

"Until a short time ago I thought it would be easy for Taft to secure a renomination. Now I am not so sure. The progressives are advancing rapidly, and they are going to capture delegates in unexpected places. It looks now as though La Follette had a chance."

"I am not working for any candidate. My work merely concerns the adoption of direct legislation. But I am not going out of the way in saying that Taft and Harmon represent the reactionary strength in the two parties, and Harmon is probably their strongest hope."
