

SIGNS WILL POINT ROUTE TO GIPSY SMITH MEETING

Directions to Be Put on Trolley Posts, Showing How to Reach Pharmacy—Details All Completed.

Finger signs are to be placed on trolley posts directing the people to the tabernacle, where Gipsy Smith will speak daily, November 10-27. The executive committee of the Gipsy Smith evangelistic campaign completed all preliminary arrangements for the meetings at a session yesterday. In addition to the finger posts a banner will be placed across the intersection of Morrison and High streets indicating the entrance to the tabernacle. All streets leading to the tabernacle will be lighted brilliantly. Dr. T. H. Walker announced that arrangements for handling the great crowds that will want to hear the famous evangelist when he comes to Portland had been all made. A physician will be kept constantly at the tabernacle ready for emergency calls. All exits will be kept ready for opening in case of need. There will be but one more meeting of the executive committee before the meetings begin. It will be held next Wednesday at noon. Gipsy Smith is expected about 5 o'clock of the same day.

Laymen Taking Interest.
"I am tremendously pleased with evidence that laymen are taking hold of arrangements for the Gipsy Smith meetings," said Dr. Benjamin Young, chairman of the executive committee yesterday.

"Many of the laymen who ordinarily do not render distinctive service have been of the greatest aid in preparing for the meetings. On the other hand many whom we naturally look to for assistance and interest have been disappointingly backward. We want the help of every Christian man in Portland."

The executive committee was intensely interested in reports of the great interest in the meetings which Gipsy Smith is now leading in Seattle. He emphasizes the people that they go home at night in groups singing. Four thousand volunteered to follow the evangelist through the streets singing revival songs. At every meeting thousands have been turned away because they could not find standing room.

Evangelist's Quick Wit.
The quick wit of the evangelist as demonstrated at the Seattle meetings was subject of amusement among the executive committee meetings. It was on a question of a collection at one of the evening meetings.

"The Lord's work needs money as well as gas," said the evangelist in pointed reference to those who testify but never give. They told the story of the man who had been married and who was met by a friend a few weeks afterward, and asked:

"Well, Bill, how does married life go?"

"Oh, all right," drawled Bill; "but it costs money, all the time, morning and night. Every time I see her she asks for money."

"What does she do with all the money?" queried the friend.

"I don't know," answered Bill; "I have never given her any yet."

"I'm not in your city for money," said Smith to the Seattleites. "I am trying to give your wives new husbands, your daughters new fathers and your mothers new sons. I want to see men saved to the service of Christ."




