CRAFTY LITTLE PORKERS HAVE NARROW ESCAPE

Amity, Or., Nov. 7.—An unusual incident happened Saturday when the Salem & Falls City Western logging train, which makes daily trips to Newberg with logs through Amity, ran down four little pigs on a high trestle just on the edge of town.

The little fellows had evidently overlooked the schedule of the logger and were feeding along the track on its time, and when they were warned by a succession of several short, sharp toots of the locomotive, evidently could not see any way of escape except straight ahead, so they fled at a winning gallop till they ran onto the trestle, but they did not get far before being overtaken.

They were too large to fall through between the ties but their feet went between about every step. When they were run down their instinct of impending danger caused them to huddle together and crouch on the ties, the locomotive and several cars passing over them before the train could be stopped.

SLAYER OF TACOMAN REMANDED TO SHERIFF

Judge Barber would give no reason for his action in remanding the prisoner to the sheriff other than that he is exercising the discretion allowed him by law.
