Grape Recipes

Grape Nectar—One pint of grape juice, two lemons, one orange, one cup of sugar or a little less, a pint of ice water. Serve cold. If served from punch bowl garnish with slices of orange and lemon. Grape Punch—Bolt together one pound of sugar and half a pint of water until it spins a thread; take from the fire and when cool add the juice of six lemons and a quart of grape juice. Stand aside overnight. Serve with plain bottled water or soda water. Grape Sherbet I—For four persons mix one half pint of underfermented grape juice with the juice of half a lemon and one half of a heaping tablespoon of gelatin dissolved in boiling water. Freeze quickly; add beaten white of one egg just before finish. Grape Sherbet II—Bolt two cups of sugar with the grated rind of one lemon and five cups of water for five minutes. Soak one half tablespoon of gelatin in a fourth of a cup of cold water and pour over it the boiling sugar. Add one cup of grape juice and the juice of two lemons. Strain and freeze, adding the beaten white of one egg when the mixture is of the consistency of mush. Grape Catsup—Eight pounds of grapes, four pounds of sugar, one quart of vinegar, three tablespoonfuls of ground cloves, three tablespoonfuls of cinnamon. Boil all together two hours, then strain through colander and bottle. Grape Vinegar may be made just as any other fruit vinegar is made, but the pulp must be squeezed from the skins before the vinegar is covered is added. Follow formula for any fruit vinegar for finishing.

Rhubarb Wine

The following is a very excellent recipe contributed by Mrs. Brun of 731 East Main street: Take 15 pounds of rhubarb stalks and grind through a food chopper. Four over two quarts of water; let stand in stone jar for two days; put in jelly bag. Mix juice with 10 pounds of sugar, pour in a five-gallon wooden keg; let stand in kitchen until through fermenting (ten to eight weeks), stirring every day with wooden stick. After fermenting, fill keg with cold water and put tight stopper in keg. Keep in cellar until March of the following year, then bottle in patent stopper bottles. After about a year in the bottle it sparkles and tastes like champagne.

Questions and Answers

Dear Miss More—Am a reader of The Journal queries. Would like you to tell me, of what use is mutton tallow to the skin, and how can it be prepared? Does sweet oil of almond make skin white? Does it also remove wrinkles? Give an inexpensive recipe for whitening the skin? Mutton tallow has a softening and smoothing effect on the skin. In my opinion it has no equal. To prepare it place the mutton fat over the fire until it is in liquid form, and pour into some vessel to cool. When cold it is ready for use. Sweet oil of almond is of softening purposes. It may be used as a massage for wrinkles, but a good cold cream is better for that purpose. Small wrinkles may be removed by massage with a good cold cream, but the massage must be regularly and rightly done. An expensive ointment, after the massage, in an old-fashioned bottle applied to the face two or three times a day for several weeks will whiten the skin beautifully and is harmless.
