

TRI-COUNTY MEET PROVES SUCCESS

Much Good Expected to Come From Development Boost at Arlington.

The recent meeting and formation of the Tri-County development league at Arlington, which includes representatives of Sherman, Gilliam and Morrow counties, will be of incalculable value to the development of that section of the state in the opinion of J. W. Whitcomb, of Gilliam county, agricultural editor, who was in charge of the farming demonstration train which made a trip through those counties last week.

"The meeting should do lots of good in every way as it will get the people of these counties together," said Mr. Whitcomb. "It should start the subscription of the large farms in that county and introduce greater diversification of crops. In order that this diversification may be furthered the business men of Portland have subscribed \$1200 to be divided equally among the three counties, which will be used to buy the best crop of field peas, corn of different kinds, alfalfa, hogs and other crops. The implement dealers of Portland have also offered five of implements for the first five acres of wheat in each county.

Real Working Men.

"Credit for the meeting and the interest being taken in this development work is due to a great measure to J. N. Ford, head of the cooperative commission. Through his efforts and the efforts of his colleagues a traveling agricultural expert is to go among the farmers and aid them with practical advice. This expert will also give all practical possible aid in carrying on the work. I think that the proposed tri-county fair if held will do a great deal of good.

"This trip of the demonstration train was the most successful yet undertaken and aroused intense interest at every point. The farmers asked questions and seemed to be present for the purpose of getting information to a greater degree than on former trips.

"The train carried a much more specialized exhibit than former trains, having but three departments, hogs, poultry and dry farming. The only exceptions to this were at Redmond, Bend and Heppner, where a dairy exhibit was shown. Redmond displayed some of the finest potatoes I have ever seen.

"The irrigated sections through which we passed are very successful and there is no reason why the dry areas should not be just as profitable. With the raising of wheat and hogs they could be made very profitable. High-tight fencing and plenty of water for drinking purposes is needed.

Fine Outlook for Hogs.

"I think in some of the sections where the tillable lands lie in large tracts the federal and state governments should cooperate and seek for artisan water. By this means thousands of acres could be made to bear heavy crops. Crook county alone contains 1,707,520
