VICTORIOUS REBELS ASK NEW MEXICAN REPUBLIC

Mexico City, Nov. 2.—Formal demands that they be allowed to establish a separate southern republic were received by President Francisco I. Madero here from the victorious rebels who put the federal army to rout at the battle of Juchitán. Madero's reticence in regard to the Juchitán battle was explained today when news of the fight arrived at the capital with the report that 700 federals had been killed after being defeated decisively. Quick to follow up this advantage, the rebels are now declaring that unless Madero gives them their proposed new republic at once they will march northward to the capital, devastating the country as they pass along.

Hillman, Or. Nov. 2.—Good Land! or Terra Bon, which means the same in Latin as the exclamation point, will be the official name of Hillman after January 1. The name of Terra Bon was suggested by Carl E. Gray, president of the S. P. & S. railway, and the government will recognize the name on the first of the year. The population of Hillman, or Terra Bon, has increased nearly 500 per cent.

"WE WANT CANADA TO BE WHITE MAN'S COUNTRY"

Ottawa, Nov. 2.—"We want the Pacific coast of Canada to become a white man's country, and not to be flooded with Asiatics from China, Japan and India," declared Premier Richard McBride of British Columbia, who is in the capital to urge positive restrictive legislation by Canada against the Asiatics. McBride declares that there are already too many Asiatics in British Columbia and that under the present laws more are pouring steadily in. He wishes the admission tax for incoming Chinese raised from \$100 to \$1,000, and

restrictions placed on Japanese and Hindus, who are now held in check by existing more substantial than the gentlemanly agreement. McBride spent today urging his cause in visits to the governor general, the Duke of Connaught and Premier Borden. He leaves tomorrow for New York.
