Bystematic investigations are being made to determine the percentage of infection in the various countles, with special referepra to rural acnool children. The results of these investigations are to be nublished from time to time. State Board Investigates.

The state board, through one of its district directors and the laboratory at Little Rock, is making examinations for diagnostic purposes without expense to physician or patient. All cases of hookworm disease are contracted through skin infection, and when it is considered that all school children in the rural districts and many adults go barefoot at least six months in the year, and so per cent of the rural schools hold their terms in the summer, when conditions are most favorable for the spread of dischas, the rural actool herafore being made the chief point of ttack. There are 6182 achoolhouses in state, with \$71,842 children of school and 20 per cent of the schools are scied under rural and semi-rural tions. This means that there are St places in the state where half a school children are in danger of racting the discase. At least 500, of these children live in communities here the hookworm has been discov-fed. Fifty of the 75 communities of its state have been visited, and it is lated that in not one rural school have proper precautions been taken to prepal cause of the infection.
