# BETTER HIGHWAYS

Goods Roads Work Indorsed by tion Next Year.

(Special to The Journal.)

Spokane, Wash., Nov. 29 .- "Let the nation tie the states together with permanent highways; let the states tie the counties together; let the counies tie the townships together and the townships can then build the dirt roads that are needed to connect the farms." This was the text of an address delivered before the first National Country Life congress, in session here, by Horatio S. Earle, former highway commissioner of Michigan.

Farmers and educators of the Pacific northwest were fired with enthusiasm over what may be accomplished in the improvement of public highways through concentrated efforts at the Tuesday session of the congress, which was devoted almost entirely to the discussion of better country roads. 


