

HOME LIFE ABSENT;
MAKES 'BAD' BOYSDelinquencies Among Children
Laid to This Cause, by
Court's Report.

"No real home life," is emphasized in the annual report of the juvenile court, just completed, as the chief reason leading to delinquency of children. The report shows a remarkable activity on the part of the court and probation officers, who have handled 634 cases the last 12 months.

The report says: "The fact that the child has been allowed to violate the curfew law and allowed to roam the streets at will, smoke, remain out of school and is generally incorrigible at home, with the further fact that in many instances it has no real home life are the causes leading to the greater crimes."

"During the year there were 150 children of tender years brought before the court for violating the curfew law." The report shows the most trouble is experienced with children between the ages of 11 and 13 years. Larceny constitutes the chief crime, and 162 children were before the court for such an offense. Destroying property is another charge prevalent among children, and 21 were called before the judge for this offense. There were four boys called into court for smoking cigarettes and seven for fighting.

The honor system has proved successful. Of the 189 cases dismissed upon the first appearance in court, only 24 have caused a second complaint. There were 196 complaints investigated and 100 of the children being brought into court, or their names being placed on the court records. Letters of warning to parents were written to the number of 184. This also proved exceedingly successful. There were 218 children with their parents brought before the probation officers, and the complaints made known to them. These complaints were settled by the officers with warning to the parents.

In closing the report says: "The 'Big Brothers' aid in keeping children from returning to the court as often as they might otherwise do, if not helped by some one interested in the life of the individual boy."

"Much credit is due the Jewish 'Big Brothers' and 'Big Sisters,' since the organization of these societies, very few Jewish children have appeared before the juvenile court. These organizations control their children in such a way that it is not necessary to bring them into court."

Will Appeal Liquor Case.

Albany, Or., Dec. 7.—Jake Bilyeu, who was arrested a few days ago on a charge of selling intoxicating liquors in violation of the local option law was sentenced by Judge Swan to a fine of \$300 and 20 days in jail. The case will be appealed. Bilyeu's bond was fixed at \$500, which he furnished.

WESLEY D. FLETCHER
WAS A FORTY-NINER

Wesley D. Fletcher, who died at Pendleton Saturday.

Pendleton, Or., Dec. 7.—Wesley D. Fletcher, whose death Saturday was due to a general breakdown, was born in England in 1834, but while young came to Canada and thence to New York state. In 1849 he sailed around the Horn to California in response to the alluring stories of the gold to be found in that state. He was engaged in mining for many years but in 1884 moved with his family to Pendleton, where he opened a jewelry and music store, which he conducted many years. He organized the famous Boy Band in 1886 and was at different times manager of a theatre and of the local telephone office. He was owner of the first independent phone line in this county. Two years ago he moved to Walla Walla to live with his daughter, Mrs. Clyde Finch, and was in Pendleton on a visit to his only other child, Robin W. Fletcher, when he died.

Begins Next Week; Evil
Has Been Rampant.

Huntington, Or., Dec. 7.—C. A. Northey, cashier of the Bank of Huntington, who was indicted with a Mrs. Shoultz by the last grand jury of Baker county, for running a house of bad repute, and whose trial has been delayed on one pretext and another, will come up before the circuit court the first of next week for trial.

The cases are the result of a campaign against houses of ill fame, public gambling and wide open Sunday saloons, and have occasioned some sharp interchanges between the conflicting forces. One of the results is that the saloon men and gamblers of the town have pledged themselves to support one preacher as against another who has been leading the fight against the red light district and wide open saloons. Strenuous efforts are being made for the coming election in February to displace several of the present council with men who desire a clean-up in the town. At present honors are with the clean-up party, who have received convictions in every case tried before the courts.
