

LESS-DEBT PARTY VICTOR AT MILTON

Defeats Ticket That Stands
for Increase of \$10,000
in Bonded Debt.

Milton, Or., Dec. 13.—Great excitement centered in the city election today. Two tickets were in the field, one nominated at the city caucus, entitled the citizen's ticket, the other an independent list called the people's ticket and nominated by petition. The former stood for the increase of the electric plant by a bond issue of \$10,000, and the latter, which won out, believed the city ought to reduce its indebtedness. The proposition to bond the city for \$10,000 to extend the barrel flume was defeated.

The results of the election follow: Mayor, H. A. Williams, People's 115, I. E. Young, Citizen's, 93; Councilmen, W. A. Gent, People's, 148; Nelson Mandela, People's, 128; G. W. Johnson, Citizen's, 123; recorder, Roy Samuels, Jr.; treasurer, T. Frazier, both endorsed by both tickets.

The Republican standpatters and the federal office holders of Arizona planned to defeat the amendment, and thus, under President Taft's action, prevent the entrance of the new state into the union. SELFISH INTERESTS OPPOSED TO PROJECT AVERS HEPPNER CLUB

(Special to The Journal.)

Heppner, Or., Dec. 13.—A delegation of Heppner citizens was sent to Pendleton to meet with the Pendleton commercial club in fighting the selfish interests of those who are for personal gains bringing all their influence to bear in promoting the Stanfield irrigation project and killing the West Umatilla project. Morrow county feels that it has the right of this West Umatilla project which will throw about 50,000 acres of Morrow county land under irrigation.

The feeling here is that it is a rank injustice to allow private individuals to promote their interests by killing a law that would provide land for settlers and those desiring land to purchase for about \$50 per acre where they are now paying from \$150 to \$300 per acre under the Stanfield project.

At a special and largely attended meeting of the Morrow County Booster club, held at Heppner, December 11, the following resolutions were unanimously adopted:

Whereas The state of Oregon has contributed to the national reclamation fund of the United States about \$9,600,000, but has profited less than has any other state, and

Whereas After many years of effort on the part of patriotic citizens and much labor on the part of the reclamation service, a portion of the great reclamation fund is about to be expended upon the West Umatilla project, which embraces some 50,000 acres of Morrow county irrigable land, and

Whereas Just at the time when the fruits of all these years of labor are about to be gathered, and the president of the United States and the secretary of the interior are favorably impressed with this project, a few misguided and selfish persons representing a private irrigation scheme at Stanfield have instituted vicious opposition to the West Umatilla project, because it would open up a great body of fine land which would be sold for about \$75 per acre, as against \$300 per acre in the Stanfield private project, and

Provide More Land.

"Whereas, The Stanfield people claim that the building of the West Umatilla project reservoir would destroy land on which are run some 4000 head of cattle and 10,000 head of sheep, we claim that after the completion of this project enough alfalfa could be raised to feed 30 times this number of stock and enough land could be reclaimed to support 1000 to 1250 families, and would add millions of dollars in taxable property to Morrow and Umatilla counties as against the ruin of a few farms on the reservoir site, therefore be it

Resolved, That we, the Morrow County Booster's club, voicing the sentiment of all Morrow county citizens, hereby deplore, and denounce the selfish and misguided and unpatriotic attitude of the said opposition toward this reclamation work.

Resolved, That we urge the president of the United States and the secretary of the interior to at once approve the West Umatilla project, and

Resolved, That a copy of these resolutions be spread upon the records of the club, that copies be forwarded to the president of the United States, to each of our senators and representatives in congress and to the press of the state."

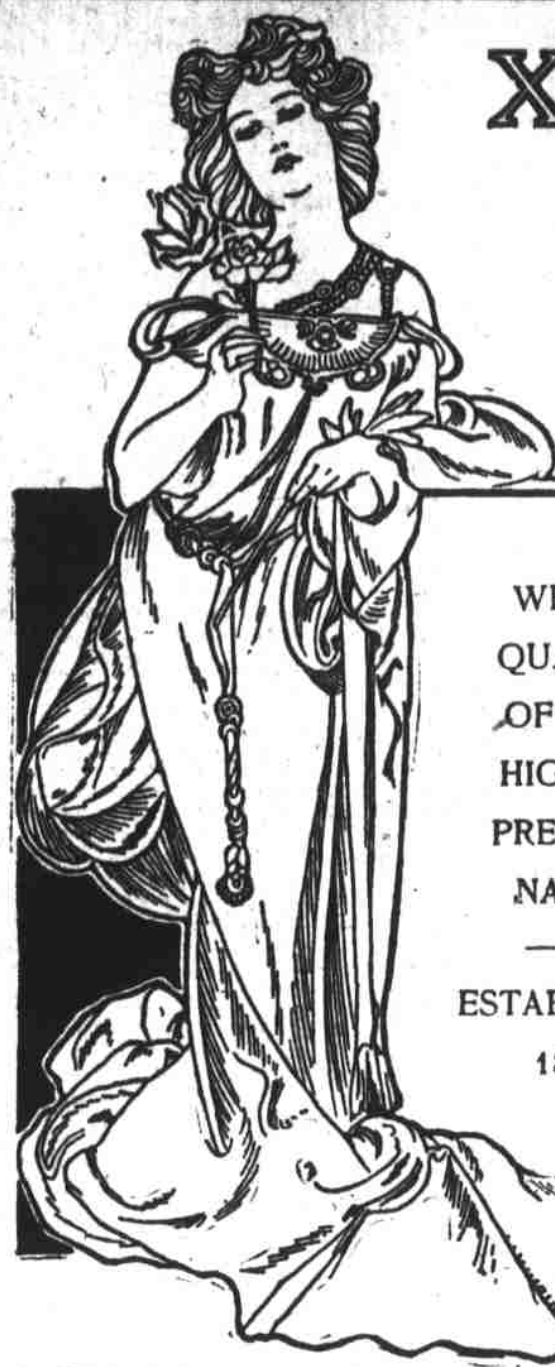
Need Progressive Fire.
