

CHARTER FRAMERS 'BURY THE HATCHET'

Amity Rules Among Factions; Consolidation Plan Draws Step Nearer.

Amity that for days had been barred from the deliberations of the people's charter committee fluttered in like the proverbial dove of peace and settled on the committee meeting at the city hall last night.

Where arguments against consolidation with the numerous other commission plans had taken all but the time needed for the expression of personal differences between committee members, a resolution favoring consolidation through action by council introduced by Richard W. Montague, was adopted with scarcely a dissenting word.

Where the majority of the committee had been bluntly adverse to considering the minority short charter report of William C. Benbow, a motion last night to spend all of Friday evening considering it, prevailed.

Council to Consider Plan.

Where time had been so fully occupied in more or less irrelevant discussions to the neglect of the commission draft the session last night was almost entirely taken up with work so that all that remains to be done is the polishing of the phrasing, the comparison with the Benbow draft, the engraving to be done by a committee composed of E. W. Montague, L. Mont Lepper and Dr. Harry Lepper, and the final filing before council meets December 27.

The resolution adopted last night favoring consolidation will be heard for action before the council at its next meeting. All the councilmen have committed themselves in favor of appointing a new committee that will compress the good part of all the proposed charters into one that may be submitted as a consolidation plan amendment to the present charter.

Mayor to Recommend.

W. C. Benbow has announced that he will seek to have his draft filed independently as a minority report if the consideration given it tomorrow evening by the general committee is not considered enough to his liking. Initiative petitions have been circulating to put the Wood short charter on the ballot.

The mayor is planning to add his recommendation to that of the people's committee so that there may be surety of bringing the best work of all the committees together. The resolution which was adopted last night reads:

"Resolved, That when the proposed charter of this committee is submitted to the council, it be accompanied by the assurance that this committee will welcome any sincere effort to reduce the number of proposed charters to be submitted to the people, provided only that the essentials of commission form of government be preserved in the draft submitted."

The people's committee does not expect to hold any meetings after this week.

Boston, Dec. 21.—Rev. C. V. T. Richeson, the Baptist minister who mutilated himself yesterday in his prison cell, where he is awaiting trial on the charge of having murdered Miss Avil Linnell, his 19-year-old sweetheart, is resting easily today after a quiet night in the jail hospital.

Medical Examiner Leary, who assisted in performing a delicate operation on Richeson after the minister had cut himself near the groin with a jagged piece of tin, declared today that Richeson will be unable to go to trial January 15, although District Attorney Pelletier stated yesterday that the accused clergyman would be called to trial on that date as scheduled.
