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BIG FREIGHTERS MEET

One Killed, Two Hurt, When Virginian Hits the Strathalbyn.

(United Press Special Wire.)
Seattle, Wash., Jan. 13.—With one sailor missing and two others injured, the big freight steamer Strathalbyn, of the American Trading company, is moored at the government buoy in Tacoma today, badly crippled as the result of a collision last night with the American-Hawaiian liner Virginian. The Virginian also proceeded to Tacoma, with a big hole in her starboard bow.

The accident happened off Three Tree Point, a few miles from this port, and was witnessed by passengers on board the Flyer, one of the Seattle-Tacoma boats. The missing sailor of the Strathalbyn is Jack Dayell, aged 19, of Scotland. He was in the forecastle, which was entirely demolished.

Firemen were thrown out of their bunks into the hold. J. Senruk and William Urdum sustained serious injuries, the first by the chest and shoulders and the latter breaking his leg.

Captain Herbert F. Beecher, the pilot in charge of the steamer Strathalbyn, is a son of the famous Henry Ward Beecher.

The steamer Oregon started to leave Salem this morning she was turned back and sent up to Corvallis. She will carry wheat between Peoria
