

TRUE BILL AGAINST W. COOPER MORRIS WILL BE DISMISSED

Kavanaugh Holds Ex-Banker
in Same Position as Wilde,
With Whom He Was Jointly
Indicted.

After considerable hesitancy before Presiding Judge Kavanaugh of the circuit court this morning, District Attorney Cameron agreed to submit a written motion to dismiss the indictment against W. Cooper Morris who was jointly indicted with Louis J. Wilde in the bank case. The district attorney stated several times to the court that no objection would be made to the court dismissing the indictment, but Judge Kavanaugh said the district attorney is the proper officer to ask for the dismissal.

Morris was allowed to change his plea from guilty to not guilty. After the judge allowed this change, District Attorney Cameron was asked for a recommendation as to the disposition of the case against Morris. Attorney Alex Sweeney, representing Morris, answered his question by saying:

"The state produced all the evidence it had against both Morris and Wilde. There is no more that can be secured or presented. Under your honor's ruling, that evidence was not found sufficient to warrant the charge of embezzlement against Wilde. I presume the same applies to the charge against Morris, as they were jointly indicted."

District Attorney Cameron admitted to the court the correctness of this statement. Whereupon Judge Kavanaugh again asked him what recommendation he would make in the case against Morris. To this the district attorney referred to the discharge of Wilde on account of insufficient evidence of a criminal nature, and the district attorney "presumed the court would dismiss the indictment against Morris."

"Do you make a recommendation or motion for a dismissal of the indictment against Mr. Morris?" ask the judge of the district attorney.

"The district attorney does not object to it," replied that officer.

"Do I understand you to make the motion now?" again asked the judge.

"Well, I would not object to it," was the answer.

"As the matter stands now," said the judge, "the plea only has been changed. The case is as before the trial of Wilde. The indictment is still against Mr. Morris. If you want the charge dismissed, it is the district attorney's office to make a motion to that effect."

"As far as my office is concerned, I do not object to the dismissal," replied the district attorney. "Under the court's ruling in the case against Wilde, I think Morris stands in the same position as did Wilde. It seems to me that Morris is entitled to the same treatment."

"If you move to dismiss the case, the motion must be in writing," said the judge to District Attorney Cameron.

"You must set out the reasons for the motion and I will allow it."

The district attorney agreed to put the motion in writing. Several attorneys in court watching the case indicated what had been done with the case, and if the district attorney moved to dismiss it.

The indications which Judge Gates refused to dismiss against Morris are still dominant. Nothing has been done to dismiss them. The district attorney said this morning he had not taken them up.

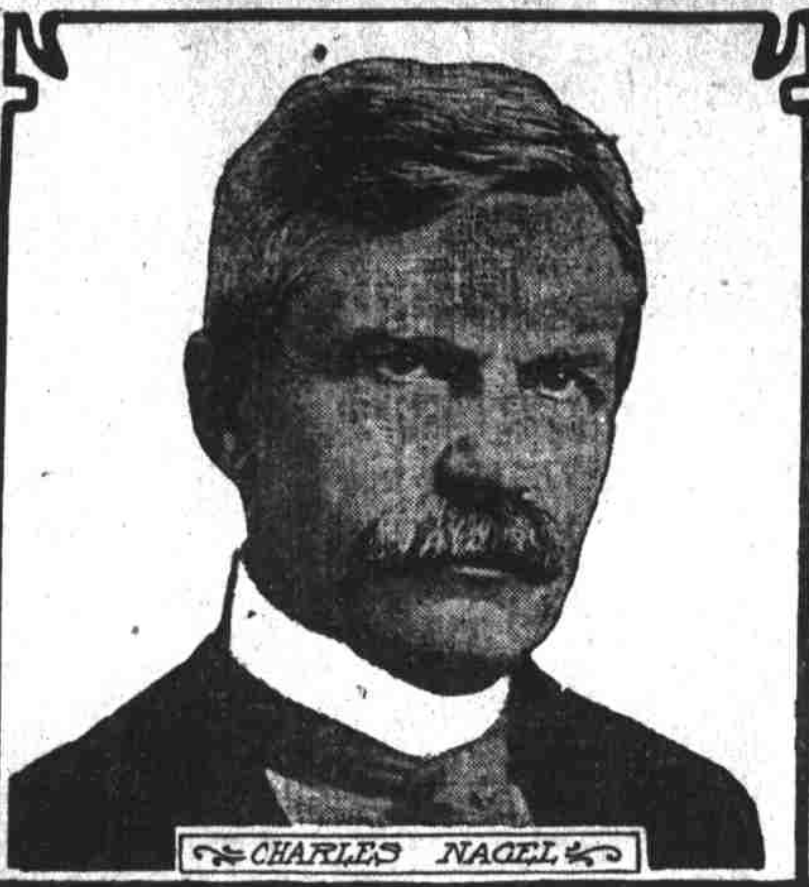

Cabinet Member for Supreme Judge



Washington, Feb. 8.—Charles Nagel, secretary of commerce and labor, will probably be appointed to the vacancy in the supreme court bench made by the death of Justice Harlan. Mr. Nagel was born in Colorado county, Texas, August 9, 1849. He graduated from the St. Louis High school in 1868, studied Roman law and political economy in the University of Berlin, was admitted to the bar in 1873 and practiced in St. Louis. He was a member of the Missouri house of representatives 1881-1882, president of the St. Louis city council, 1893-1897, and entered President Taft's cabinet in March, 1909.

United States Judge W. C. Hook of Kansas had been looked upon as the man most likely to be picked by the president for the seat but at a meeting of the cabinet yesterday he is said to have been eliminated from consideration on account of his concurrence in the "Jim Crow" law decision in a case from Oklahoma in which an attempt was made to force railroads to provide dining cars and sleeping cars for negroes.

**FORMER PHILIPPINE SCHOOL TEACHER TO HERD
1200 TURKEYS ON REMOTE UPPER DESCHUTES**

Bend, Or., Feb. 8.—Twelve hundred turkeys feeding on grasshoppers around Davis lake and Crane prairie, will likely be the strange sight encountered by visitors to Davis lake and Crane prairie, on the upper Deschutes river, next summer. The fowls will be herded just as sheep are, if the plan of C. D. Schell of La Pine do not miscarry. He has applied to Supervisor J. Roy Harvey of the Deschutes national forest, at his office here, for a permit to use part of Uncle Sam's domain for turkey ranch. There are thousands of grasshoppers in the vicinity selected and Mr. Schell doesn't want to see them go to waste when good turkeys are so scarce.

throwing the Diaz regime, today sent the following telegram to the United Press here from Chihuahua:

"The state of Chihuahua is displaying discontent with the Madero government for not having fulfilled promises made during the revolution which he headed, and for the reason that the people believe Madero incapable of carrying out his promises."

Permit me to reserve my personal opinion. I only know as a soldier, that I am obliged to die in defense of the constitutional government.

"I understand news dispatches, spread broadcast with the object of casting doubts upon my loyalty and honor, have been paid for by my enemies. But I look for justification to the Mexican sense of fair play and in the judicious opinion of the American people."

"Replying to the charges that my conduct is unpatriotic, I can only say that if loyalty to the constitution, my service to my fatherland without recompense, and a vain yearning to retire to private life constitutes a stain upon the right course of conduct, then I am wanting in patriotism."

Madero Says Nothing to Fear.

New York, Feb. 8.—"American interests in Mexico have nothing to fear." This is the substance of a reassuring telegram to the United Press today from President Francisco I. Madero of Mexico. He said:

"The troubles in the state of Chihuahua are merely mutinies of undisciplined soldiers and are without political goal. I am confident that within a few days tranquility and calm will be completely reestablished in the state."

"After 35 years of oppression the

press of Mexico is now absolutely free, but in certain cases it has overstepped the limits of prudence. It will soon change its attitude, however, as the public realizes its exaggerations and appeals to passion and begins to lose confidence in it."

"But with the aid of the people who are entirely with me I am sure we will realize our plans soon."

Madero Garrison Mutinies.

El Paso, Texas, Feb. 8.—Reports have reached here that the Madero garrison at Casas Grandes had mutinied. Colonel Omayra, commander of the fiscal guards of Juarez, accompanied by three officers, left Juarez at once on a special train. They carried white flags and will endeavor to persuade the mutineers to return to allegiance under Madero.

Rebels Capture Towns.

Mexico City, Feb. 8.—Rebels today captured the towns of Cocoyotla and Santa Rosalia, in the state of Chihuahua, according to dispatches received here. A mob at Cocoyotla, it is reported, dragged the district judge from his bench, murdered him and cut him to pieces.

attempt at destruction. Although several thousand Ulstermen gathered near the park, they made no attempt to break past the line of guards and policemen.

During the course of his address at Celtic Park, Churchill was interrupted by suffragettes in the audience, who demanded to know what the government proposed in regard to the question of votes for the women of Ireland.

Churchill replied:

"That question can safely be left to the decision of the Irish parliament."

Continuing, Churchill said:

"I look forward to the time when the accused machinery by which hatred has been manufactured shall have been broken forever. I want to assure the residents of Ulster that fears that their liberty might be assailed or their faith persecuted are absolutely groundless."

Following his address at Celtic Park, Churchill and Mrs. Churchill were escorted by a troop of cavalry and police to the railroad station, where they boarded a train for Scotland. They were not molested. The fact that it was decided to hold the meeting at Celtic Park instead of in the famous old Ulster hall had the effect of quieting anticipated trouble. Had the meeting been held in the hall as originally intended rioting undoubtedly would have resulted.

Kisses and Applause Mingled.

When Churchill began speaking there were 8000 nationalists inside the great tent and 12,000 outside. His remarks were greeted with mingled kisses and applause. Churchill declared that the ship company of Seattle, was taken to
