

WIRELESS WILL BE INSTALLED ON TWO OLD-TIME VESSELS

St. Nicholas and Reuce to Be Made Modern in This Respect at Cost of \$1500 Each; in Alaska Service.

The wireless apparatus will be placed on the famous old ships St. Nicholas and Reuce, which were for many years the pride of the Atlantic, according to Seattle advices, and when they sail from the Columbia river this spring for Bristol bay, they will be able to communicate with any of the coast stations or with the coastwise and oriental vessels of the north Pacific.

The two windjammers are operated in the Alaska service in connection with the salmon canneries at Nushagak and Chignik and are owned by the Columbia River Packers' association.

The steamer *Reuce* will be towed down through the bridges from the main-Pontiac mill-ery's wharf this afternoon by the *Oakham*. She has 575,000 feet of lumber for San Pedro. The *Reuce* tender *Heather* left down for Astoria this morning after undergoing an overhauling and being cleaned and painted.

On her first trip to this port in two years, the steamer *Raymond*, Captain C. A. Krudsen, arrived last night at 11:30 with general freight from San Francisco. She will run here during the summer, bringing freight on the Olson & Mahony line and will go to Raymond to load lumber for California.

At a meeting of the Port of Portland commission yesterday afternoon, bids for food supplies for the steamers and dredgers of the port were opened. They were left to General Manager Talbot to award to the lowest bidder. The commission authorized a contract for a 100-volt current for the drydock at the same rate as the Portland Railway, Light & Power company gives the city here.

Advice from Bureka, Cal., state that J. H. Price has resigned as superintendent of the Bendixen shipyards and will come to St. Helens to establish a shipbuilding plant there. He is said to be backed by the Charles R. McCormick Lumber company, and that a new steamer, somewhat larger than the *Williamette*, will be built there.
