Palling to convince the mayor that thair charges were well founded, it is said, the union delegates then said the prices quoted in the bids recommended for award were too high. They saked the mayor to use his efforts with the executive board to have all the bids rejected and new ones invited.

If this action is taken a new contract

can hardly be awarded in time to have the apana illuminated for firsts week. as much of the electric fixtures necessary, it is said, must be shipped from the east.

The lighting committee recommended Northwest Electrical Engineering com-pany, for \$3837.08, that being the lowest tender for that span. It recommended that the centract for the lighting of the Hawthorne and Burnside bridges Strictly modern new 11-room be given to the West Const Engineering company, for \$9591. This latter company is said to be on the unfair list of the unions.

Mayor Rushlight told the delegation that he could not see his way clear to interfere in the matter unless it could make a showing that there had been irregularities in the bids. Several other companies also submitted bids, but these were all higher than those of the two companies already named. The unions will probably carry the fight before the executive board, and will en-deavor to have the board disapprove the action of its committee and order all bids rejected and new tenders asked.
